5 Force Support Battalion REME

On 24th June, 104 (FS) Bn REME marched on to Lucknow Square to take part in a parade to mark their transformation into 5 Force Support Battalion, Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers. The inspecting Officers were: Master General REME, Lt Gen Andrew Figgures CB CBE; GOC Theatre Troops, Maj Gen TB Radford DSO OBE and Colonel REME, Colonel Dan Scott ADC.

The Battalion is an important unit for the REME because it holds one of the Army's two Power Pack repair Platoons as well as specialist repair Platoons for Electronic Counter Measure equipment and Base Intelligence, Surveillance, Target Acquisition and Reconnaissance equipment.

The formation of 5 (FS) Bn REME is one of the first moves towards future Army 2020 structures.

The magnificent statue at the entrance to the parade square, of the horse and



lightning flash from the REME cap badge, was made by Sgt Paul Bateson and his team of metalsmiths.

General looks forward to challenges ahead

The new General Officer Commanding 3rd (UK) Division has described his delight at 'coming home' to Bulford.

Major General James Cowan returns to Salisbury Plain having previously served with 'The Iron Division' as Chief of Staff and as a Brigade Commander in Afghanistan.

The father of three, who moved to the area last month after 3 years at the Ministry of Defence in London, said: "I know the 3rd Division really well and it's nice to be 'coming home'".

The General arrives as the Division is preparing for its new high readiness 'Reaction Force' (RF) role and the end of combat operations in Afghanistan.

"It's a very exciting development. The Army is re-organising itself, getting smaller and more integrated with its reserves. It's going to have two parts, the 'Reaction Force' and the 'Adaptable Force'.

Two of the three brigades that will be in the Reaction Force – 1 and 12 – are already on Salisbury Plain and they will be joined by a third brigade, 20 Brigade, coming back from Germany. I think that's a really logical, sensible thing to do as it gets all of that 'RF' in one place around the Plain and the training facilities.

"Our outgoing brigade, 4 Brigade, will join the Adaptable Force and it's also got a very exciting programme ahead of it and some very interesting things going on there."

General Cowan's last job was as the head of counter-terrorism in the MOD, with responsibility for the planning of the military security of the 2012 Olympic Games – for which he received a CBE in the Queen's Birthday Honours in June.

"I really enjoyed it and I think that all of us can take great pride in the huge success of the London Games", he said. "I am a soldier and I'd never been involved in an operation which is fundamentally a sporting event, but I think after the Games everybody realised just what a fantastic thing the British Army had done."

General Cowan is now firmly looking forward to the next 2 years in Bulford and the challenges ahead for the Division and its units :

"When I joined the Army in the 1980s we were preparing for a Soviet invasion and everyone was focussed on The Cold War. And then the Berlin Wall came down and all of that changed. We all wondered at that time if there would be a real role for our Army.

"The 20 years that have passed since have been extremely busy – the First Gulf War, Sierra Leone, Bosnia and Kosovo, Iraq and Afghanistan. So I think it would be very unwise of me to predict where the next crisis will be, but one thing I can be certain of is that there will be one and the British Army will continue with its tradition of engagement around the world in the way that our government wishes."



"I am completely sure the 3rd Division will have as busy a future as it has had a busy past," he concluded.

Troops from Bulford's 3rd (UK) Division Headquarters and Signal Regiment have visited France to take part in a series of events to mark the 69th anniversary of the D-Day landings. The signallers attended a number of official commemorations across the Normandy countryside, including at 'Sword Beach', the point where 'The Iron Division' landed during the amphibious assault on 6 June 1944. They were joined by a handful of veterans who had served with the Division during the Normandy campaign.

Cashpoint Tampering

Would you know how to spot if a machine has been tampered with? Wiltshire Police Volunteer, Michael Bayliss, writes :



There is a risk associated with use of ATMs, known as cash point machines. Thieves either target your cash, or they are after your card details. In order to steal cash they fit a blocking mechanism into the cash dispenser, which diverts the cash, so that it is stuck just inside the machine. The user finds the cash does not come out and leaves, the offender comes back and fishes the notes out from just inside the machine. The only indication of tampering is a bent cover to the cash port. In order to clone or make use of your card, they need your card details and PIN number. In the early days someone would hang around and try and see the PIN number being typed in, but now they fit a metal bar above the key pad, with a mini camera in it. In order to get the card details they either need the card, or they need to read it somehow. For this they need to tamper with the card port, or get full details off the card. So the indicators of tampering are a strip of metal with a pin hole above the key pad, or something extra fitted to the card port. If you see any signs of tampering, do not use the machine. Some machines are targeted more than others. Factors include whether the machine is inside or outside, whether it is covered by CCTV, whether the location is isolated or busy. Currently the criminal fraternity have not produced a system which leaves no trace of tampering. So any user who has a good look at the whole machine should be able to use it without mishap.

The alternative is to get cashback whenever you use your card in a garage or shop.

New Freeride Mountain Bike Tracks open in Tidworth



"Tidworth Freeride", on the southern edge of Tidworth, was officially opened on 14th June by Lt Col Barron, Commander of Tidworth, Netheravon and Bulford Garrison.

"The work that has gone into this is amazing - great credit to the volunteers who have put it together", said Lt Col Barron. "It is a really fantastic asset for the local community, both military and civilian".

Four years of negotiations between the Tidworth Freeriders, the Defence Infrastructure Organisation and the national cycling charity, CTC, have resulted in 6 downhill tracks, a progressive jump area and some dirt trails built on MOD woodland between the A338 and the ridge track at the top of the hill.

"The trails have something for all abilities, whether it's your first time on a mountain bike or if you are a more experienced rider looking to hone your skills", said Phil Potts, Secretary of the Tidworth Freeride.

And the view of professional Freerider, Chris Smith: "I really rate it!", he said.
