A Farewell Message from Colonel Paddy Tabor



Four and a half years have flown past and I write this on leaving the post as Garrison Commander.

My time has seen unprecedented change in the Garrison.

Everywhere, new buildings have arisen and older ones have either been demolished or refurbished thus making this Garrison a fantastic place in which to live and work. New houses have been put up for our families, and we have also seen significant improvements to existing estates.

Army 2020 heralds more change -

4000 extra soldiers between Larkhill and Perham Down. Salisbury Plain will house three armoured infantry brigades. New regiments will arrive from 2017 necessitating more accommodation, HQs, hangars and workshops. 700 more families will need houses.

As we work inside the Garrison by day and return to our MOD provided houses at night, it is easy to overlook that we are part of the local community. Our children attend local schools, we shop locally, many partners work in the local economy and many choose to settle nearby on retiring. As we become firmly established here, we should embrace the local community more. Tidworth Mums leads the way recruiting members from the non-military community. The Salisbury Plain Military Wives Choir performs nationally and locally. Op Clean Sweep demonstrates our commitment to the environment. The new Garrison Theatre will be a focus for community-based entertainment. We constitute more than half of the local population - what about representation on town and parish councils? I believe we should be influencing what happens locally. Tidworth is, after all, a garrison town.

Sport is one area where military and civilian communities can coalesce - we have extraordinarily good facilities. Building on the Olympic legacy, using our sports pitches, running tracks, riding centre and Leisure Centre, it would be exciting to see the Army lead on creating sports and athletics clubs and adventure training groups, to involve all local young people and create real togetherness.

I would like to pay tribute to all who work so hard to make the Garrison tick. First, our contractors from Aspire Defence Services Limited, who keep everything going - and there is a lot to do. We are very lucky to live and work where we do and equally fortunate to have contractors who really 'get it', understanding us, what we do and why. Second, the small Garrison HQ staff has been immensely professional allowing you all to do your jobs while ensuring Garrison activities run smoothly. I am hugely grateful to them for their steadfast support - and good humour. Last, thank you to those organisations that help in all sorts of ways: schools; businesses; and individuals who make our lives and those of our families better.

To command the Army's largest garrison has been the most enormous privilege and to do it for so long an added bonus. I believe the Garrison to be in excellent shape. There is much exciting change coming. I would like to thank you all for your hard work and support and wish you the very best of luck for the future.



What's in a name ?

Tedworth House Recovery Centre receives Royal Visitors



HRH The Duke of Cambridge is welcomed to Tedworth House by Bryn and Emma Parry, Co-Founders of the charity, 'Help for Heroes'.

Their Royal Highnesses The Duke of Cambridge and Prince Harry visited the Tedworth House Recovery Centre on 20th May, to officially open the four Recovery Centres in Tidworth, Catterick, Colchester and Plymouth.

These Centres are part of the Ministry of Defence Recovery Capability, an MOD-led initiative, managed in partnership with Help for Heroes and The Royal British Legion and designed to ensure wounded, injured and sick service personnel receive coordinated long-term support.

Tedworth House operating costs are funded by Help for Heroes with a significant contribution from their principal partner, The Royal British Legion.

The Princes were shown the magnificent facilities in the House and the state-of-the-art adaptive sports Phoenix Centre before meeting wounded veterans, serving personnel and their families to hear first-hand about the life-long challenges they face.

Afterwards, in the courtyard beside the new Help for Heroes statue, Their Royal Highnesses spoke with Cpl Claire Edwards, SSgt Steve Arnold and Cpl Charlie Lemon, all on hand bikes, before launching the Help for Heroes fundraiser Hero Ride which takes place on 2nd June.



News from 2RTR in Theatre

Lance Corporal Billy Nelson is part of the Military Working Dog Squadron, working hand-in-paw with Dream, a three-year-old black Labrador specially trained to sniff out explosives.



Billy is a soldier in the 2nd Royal Tank Regiment, and normally serves on a Challenger 2 main battle tank. However, being a dog lover and owner of a chocolate Labrador, he jumped at the chance to be a Search Dog Handler after an opportunity arose to work with dogs in Afghanistan.

He underwent a five week course, which included how to bond with dogs, search practice and veterinary instruction, and once he arrived in Afghanistan he began working with Dream straight away. Billy and Dream patrol with British troops for anything from a few hours to several days, and their services are in high demand. Speaking about the bond he has formed with Dream, Billy said:

"Out here, she's quite simply my best friend. It's impossible not to grow so fond of her, especially since she's saving my life and the lives of the guys on patrol."

News from 1RRF in Theatre

Soldiers of 1st Battalion The Royal Regiment of Fusiliers (1RRF) have been deployed in the Nahr-e Saraj district of Helmand Province since March 2013, operating in support of their Afghan partners along the Helmand River valley, the key route Highway One and the Nahr-e Bugra Canal.

The Fusiliers have recently handed control of Check Point Abpashak East to the Afghan Uniformed Police (AUP).



"The handover of Abpashak East signals the growing ability of the Afghans to take the lead in security", said Lt Col Jon Swift, Commanding Officer of the Transition Support Unit in Nahr-e Saraj, 1RRF.

Major Chris Head, OC Y Coy, 1RRF, said:

"The Afghans have a large network of checkpoints spread all along the major routes, predominantly on Highway One. They fully understand the importance of this location, they have resourced it well and there is more building work going on to reinforce the area."

Fusilier Michael Inglis, Fire Support Group, 1RRF, who was based at Check Point Abpashak East since deploying to Afghanistan in March, said :

"We have had no trouble in the area, the locals have been friendly and the AUP have been out doing their patrols in the night time and during the day."

1RRF are deployed to Afghanistan as part of Operation Herrick 18. There are now just 11 UK bases in Helmand Province, down from 37 in October 2012.

Archaeology helps Recovery

Some injured soldiers have found archaeology to be the key to helping them on the road to recovery, after taking part in digs on Salisbury Plain led by the DIO's senior Historic Advisor, Richard Osgood. The success of the project inspired the creation of 'Op NIGHTINGALE' in partnership with Wessex Archaeology and several



soldiers have gone on to study the subject.

Last month, ex-Riflemen Steve Winston, (who now works for Wessex Archaeology), and Tyler Christopher, (4 RIFLES), were back at another dig on the Plain, to pass on their expertise and help boost the confidence of a group of teenagers taking part in a course run by the Jon Egging Trust.



The Trust was set up in memory of ex-Red Arrow pilot Jon Egging ('Red 4'), who lost his life in an air accident in 2011.

Some Crime Prevention Tips as the weather gets warmer...
