Prince Harry visits Tedworth House

HRH Prince Harry visited Tedworth House on Monday 23rd January, to find out more about the Help for Heroes 'Hidden Wounds' service and the range of support available within the field of military mental health.

This was the Prince's third visit to Tedworth House and he was welcomed on arrival by Sarah Troughton, Lord Lieutenant of Wiltshire, Melanie Waters, the new CEO of Help for Heroes, and David Richmond, the Director of Recovery for the charity.



During the Prince's visit, he also saw some of the wider programmes available at Tedworth House, designed to promote wellbeing. Out in the grounds of the Recovery Centre he met some members of 'Team Roundhouse'

who have been building a replica iron-age house in the woodland. When completed, it will be used for relaxation workshops, craft activities and outdoor cooking. The Prince chatted with members of the team who are making furniture for the roundhouse from trees felled in the woods and doors for it with wood from the 200-year old cedar tree which used to grow at the front of Tedworth House.



One member of the team is ex-Rifleman Mike Day who is helping to carve designs onto the woodwork of the roundhouse. He described what the project has meant for him :

"It's been massively important - a beacon for me. I come here once a month and it's about the only social thing that I do, due to my injuries. It's been

life-changing. We've made something here - all the people that are involved in it are injured in some way, be it mental health or physical health, all through injuries sustained while on active service."

The Prince also visited Tedworth House's thriving fruit and vegetable garden. These two projects give the people taking part in them the opportunity to work outdoors and to be creative while learning new skills, providing a sense of achievement and camaraderie and the feeling of being part of something again.

The 'Hidden Wounds' psychological wellbeing service provides free and confidential support to Ex-Service Personnel, their families and the families of those still serving, who are living with anxiety, depression, stress, anger or early stage alcohol issues. The service has helped 1,000 people since it began.

HRH The Countess of Wessex visited 5 RIFLES in Bulford on 11th January. This was her first visit to them since their move here from Germany last year.

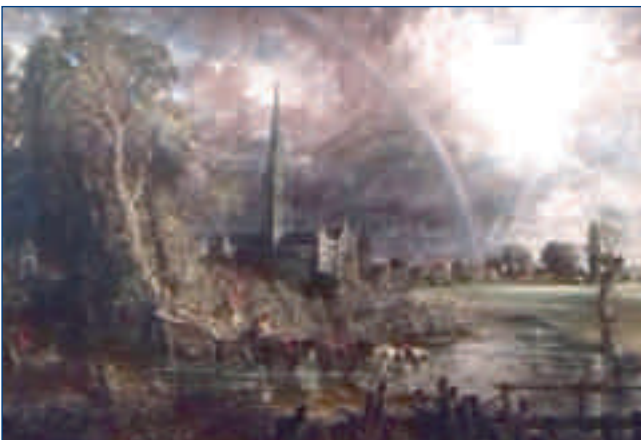


The Countess, who is Royal Colonel of the Regiment, received a Regimental update from the Commanding Officer, Lt Col Mark Wilson, and viewed the

Ashdown Estate news



The first tranche of hundreds of new Service family homes being built in Tidworth has been completed. A total of 322 homes are being delivered by the Defence Infrastructure Organisation (DIO) working with contractor Hills, as part of the Army Basing Programme.

The £73 million project at the Ashdown Estate is ahead of schedule with 35 properties now finished. The remaining 287 homes, still under construction, will be completed during 2017, with the final homes ready for occupancy by Service families in March 2018.

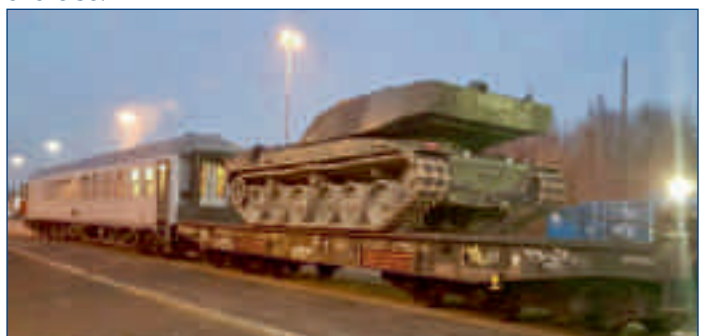


Garrison Units take part in Logistics Exercise

A Day out for Bulford Pupils

Pupils from Bulford St Leonard's Primary School spent the day at SeaCity in Southampton recently, as part of their Titanic project.

The Year 5 and 6 students were able to experience what life was like on the board the ill-fated ship by dressing up as passengers before taking part in some interesting "Titanic-themed" activities and touring the museum.



"The museum was very hands-on and the children enjoyed exploring the exhibits," said Karen Jeffery, Year 5/6 teacher.

Helen Mathieson, CEO of Salisbury Plain Academies of which Bulford St Leonard's is a part, said: "It's very important for children to experience the world beyond the classroom - where learning really comes to life. These sorts of experiences help to improve academic achievement and the personal, social and emotional development of our pupils."

Home Security Advice

Following a series of burglaries and attempted burglaries in this area, the Police have provided the following home security advice :



- Keep all doors locked even when you are in the house to prevent people walking in without you knowing. Double check they are locked at night.
- Fit doors with mortice locks.
- All windows should be fitted with locks, except those designated as fire escapes, and remember to use them - especially for windows on the ground floor.
- Keep valuable items out of view and mark them with a property marking system.
- Never leave a spare key in a plant pot or letter box, a thief will know where to look.
- Secure the rear of your property. Make sure you have good lighting around your property and consider investing in a burglar alarm.
- Keep car keys out of sight.
- Lock tools and ladders away so thieves can't use them to break in.
- Make sure you have up-to-date contents insurance.
- Do not keep large amounts of cash at home - it is much safer in a bank or building society.
- Don't keep valuable items on display and always keep purses and wallets hidden away.
- Never keep PIN numbers with credit or debit cards.
- Make sure any hedging at the front of your property is no higher than one metre. This will allow you and people passing by to see anyone acting suspiciously.
- Take photographs of all jewellery, including hallmarks, and keep them safe. Do not leave valuable jewellery in a box on your dressing table as it's the first place a thief will look. Choose another container and another place in the house.
- Make a list of the serial number of your electronic items and keep it safe.
- If you are going on holiday - Inform trusted friends / neighbours and ask them to keep an eye on your property and collect your post. Consider purchasing timers for your lights as signs of occupation to help deter thieves. Remember to cancel deliveries such as newspapers and milk.
- Be vigilant and if you see anyone acting suspiciously, take their description and details of any vehicle registration, including direction of travel. Call the police on 101, or 999 if they are about to break into a property.

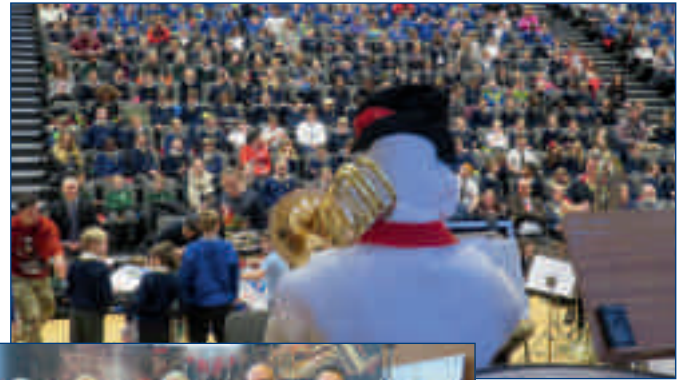
