More Foxhounds are on the Way

The purchase of 25 additional Foxhound vehicles was confirmed by the Minister for Defence Equipment Support and Technology, Peter Luff MP, at the 4 Brigade media day held in Bulford last month.

The Foxhound has a top speed of 70 mph and, for its size and weight, it provides unprecedented levels of blast protection. The engine can be removed and replaced in just 30 minutes and it can drive away from an ambush on only three wheels.

"We ordered 200 in 2010; another 100 in February this year and today we are

ordering a further 25," said the Minister. "The Foxhound is very likely to become a core vehicle for the future because the kind of conflicts we're likely to be engaged in will need the levels of protection and mobility it offers. It is a British-built vehicle, incorporating motor sport technology. The guys who drive it say it is easy to drive and as easy to maintain as the manufacturers claim, so that's good!"

The Foxhound has already been trialled in Afghanistan and 4 (Mech) Brigade will be the first to fully utilise it in theatre when they take over from Bulford-based 12 (Mech) Bde in the Autumn.

4 Mech Brigade, known as "The Black Rats" whose Headquarters is in Catterick, has been taking part in its final Mission Ready Exercise on Salisbury Plain before deploying to Afghanistan in the Autumn.

"We are the best prepared and best equipped Task Force that has ever deployed", said Brigade Commander, Brigadier Bob Bruce, speaking about the deployment. "We will continue to develop this process of enabling the Afghan National Security Forces to take control for security in their own areas, and that's going to involve us working very closely alongside them. And of course, this is their counter-insurgency. It is in their country, and they must win it for themselves. Our role will be to support them, to help them, even to enable them where we can to do that, but it is theirs".

Brigadier Bruce used an Afghan phrase, 'shana bashana', ("shoulder-to-shoulder"), to describe the working partnership between UK forces and the ANSF which will continue to be developed over the course of HERRICK 17.

Due to significant progress made by the Afghan National Security Forces in Helmand province, it is anticipated that the UK's phased drawdown in numbers of manpower and materiel in Afghanistan will begin during HERRICK 17, with Brigadier Bruce committing to sending 500 British troops back to the UK by the end of the year.

KRH help out at Afghan Community Event



The first community engagement event in Helmand, organised by the Afghan Police, attracted over 200 children and their parents, in an area once considered a hotbed of insurgency. The event was supported by members of The King's Royal Hussars and 1st Battalion Welsh Guards and provided an opportunity for the younger generation of Babaji to meet and interact with the Policeman responsible for their security.

Describing the improvement of security in the area Captain Ben Figures-Wilson the Officer in Charge of the Police Advisory Team said:

"When the Welsh Guards were last deployed to Afghanistan this area was virtually impassable. Any attempts to patrol through Babaji were met with heavy resistance. It is testament to the combined efforts of the Afghan Security Forces and ISAF that today we can concentrate on Community Engagement initiatives such as this."

Captain Esmerai, the local Afghan Police Precinct Commander who hosted the occasion, talked to the children, explaining the role of his Policemen. The parents in attendance were also given the opportunity to ask questions about future security plans for the area.

Major Alex Michael, OC C Sqn, The King's Royal Hussars and Ian Connolly MOD Police Mentor, spoke to the children explaining the importance of education and living within the law.

"I wanted the children to understand that the gift of education should not be taken for granted", said Major Michael. "They are the future of this area and the security that is provided by the Police Force has made it possible for them to return to school. The sheer number of children and parents in attendance today demonstrates an appetite for stability that will allow the children of this area to prosper."

"It is vitally important that the children understand that the Police are the good guys", said Ian Connolly. "An opportunity to interact with the local population in this way is invaluable to the development of community relationships."

Afghan Police Commander, Captain Esmerai described the future vision for his area:

"We have driven out the insurgents in Babaji and we must now concentrate our efforts on the maintenance of security in order to develop the local community. The children and families must help us in our efforts and today they have embraced my request for support."

The children were entertained with a drill demonstration provided by members of the Afghan Police and received gifts of footballs, kites, pencil cases and notebooks.

Following the success of this event the Afghan Police intend to develop a series of future events tackling pertinent topics such as IED awareness, the importance of living within the law and the role of the Police Force in Afghanistan.

The smiles and positive comments from people passing through the security checkpoint kept the Fusiliers going despite the huge number of people that needed to be cleared before entering this historic venue.

Some of the Athletes' families had not anticipated the time it would take to get through the huge crowds; some struggled to make it through the venue on time to see their loved ones' victory ceremonies : Major Chris Head, OC Y Coy, rushed to the podium with US winner Kristin Armstrong's son, delivering him into her arms as she descended from the podium, while Corporal Phillip Kerr reacted quickly when it became clear that Catherine Wiggins and her children might not make it in time to see her record-breaking husband Bradley as he crossed the finish line. She later tweeted:

"I want to say a heartfelt thanks to the Army today who made our day all the more special. It is they who make me proud to be British helping me and the kids to get to the medal ceremony. So nice."

With two medals for Team GB, Bronze for Chris Froome and Gold for Bradley Wiggins, the Fusiliers couldn't help but be swept along by the jubilant atmosphere and Wiggo mania at the ceremony. LCpl Jake Barrington, Fus Daniel



Booth, LCpl William Clifford, Fus Adam Hill and LCpl Andrew Smart all sported his

trademark sideburns along with thousands of others in the crowd.

The long hours of training and hard work paid off and the Fusiliers received showers of thanks from the organisers, athletes and spectators alike. This was a day that none of those involved will ever forget !

Congratulations to Captain Heather Stanning from 32 Regt RA in Larkhill who, with her rowing partner, Helen Glover, won the first Gold Medal for Team GB in the 2012 Olympic Games. Their win in the Women's Coxless Pairs race not only broke the Olympic record but was also the first ever

gold medal for a British women's rowing team.

The post box at Larkhill Post Office has been painted gold in recognition of their achievement.



Several athletes connected with the Forces are taking part in the Paralympic Games and most of them have, in some way, benefited from the "Battle Back" programme, designed to get them into sport after serious injury. Major Martin Colclough took on the Battle Back brief just over four years ago and now leads the programme from his desk at
