

The Snail and the Whale



Children in the Garrison were invited to the Bulford Study Centre on 9th May to see "The Snail and the Whale", a show based on the children's story by Julia

Donaldson, the Children's Laureate. An added attraction throughout the afternoon was the BFBS "ice cream ops" van, handing out free ice cream to the children.



The two performances at the Study Centre were organised by Storybook Soldiers, a group of volunteers based in this Garrison which helps deploying soldiers record bedtime stories for their children to listen to while they are away. The shows were performed by the Tall Stories Theatre Company which has produced several shows based on Julia Donaldson's other books in the past. Co-Director of Tall Stories, Toby Mitchell, tucked into his ice cream as he explained:

"The Snail and the Whale" is one we have had our eyes on for years but we've never worked out a way of putting it on stage ! But then I read a news story a couple of years ago about Storybook Soldiers who help soldiers serving abroad record bedtime stories onto CDs for their children at home - and one of their favourite stories was "Snail and the Whale". And I started thinking, 'a small thing wants to go round the world with a big thing ... so we could have a little girl at home and her father serving abroad ... and that seemed to be our way into the story. And discussing it with Julia Donaldson ... she gave us the idea of putting live music with it which we don't usually do. ... We've got this electric viola to create the sea and the storms and all the sound effects !"

With 12 Brigade in Afghanistan at the moment, the story certainly struck a chord with the two military audiences.

As one person commented :

"I hope they will come down again when WE deploy next year!"

Hoping to go for Gold

LCpl Victor Ahiavor of 1RRF is waiting to find out whether or not he has been successful in his attempt to qualify to compete in the Judo event at the London Olympics.

LCpl Ahiavor grew up in Ghana and joined the Fusiliers in 2006. Prior to joining he won silver for his country in an international competition and has since been training with the British Army Judo Team.

Balancing both his military and sporting career has seen him deploy to Iraq on TELIC 7 and put in a strong performance on the gruelling Fire Team Commanders' Course, as well as compete in the Commonwealth Games in 2010.

Due to being a Ghanaian national, he does not qualify for the British national team support and so he has had to raise all of the funds on his own. Help from the Regiment has enabled him to travel to competitions in Mongolia, Japan, France and Morocco, and climb from 68th in the world to within the top 30, within the last 2 years. After a 5th place result in both the Commonwealth Games and his last competition in Morocco, he now stands a very good chance of qualifying for the Olympic Games and representing both his country and The Royal Regiment of Fusiliers.

LCpl Ahiavor has attempted to remain focussed on his training rather than worry about the up coming games.

"I was aiming to be in the top 50 this year and so I'm incredibly happy to be in the top 30. All I have to do now is focus on my training so that if I do qualify, I'll be ready!"

The Olympics isn't the only thing that LCpl Ahiavor has on his mind though; he is looking forward to the Battalion's upcoming tour on OP HERRICK 18. He expects to deploy with W Company before returning in time to train for the 2014 Commonwealth Games.



KRH takes over in Lashkar Gah

The King's Royal Hussars have taken over responsibility for the Lashkar Gah district within the Helmand Province from The Queen's Royal Hussars. The municipality of Lashkar Gah was the first area in Helmand to transition from an ISAF security lead to the Afghan forces. This has been a gradual process but the Afghan Police are now well established and confident in directing security operations within and around the District Centre of Lashkar Gah.

Lt Col Alex Potts, commanding The King's Royal Hussars and the Combined Force for Lashkar Gah, is confident about the next six months, he said:

"I have visited Lashkar Gah on a number of occasions in the past year and I have been struck by the progress made by our colleagues in the Afghan National Security Forces. In many areas you encounter police working closely with government officials and community leaders to resolve the problems encountered in the rural villages around Lashkar Gah. This is just one indication that security and economic prosperity can be provided on an enduring basis without the direct support of ISAF troops.

"Our goals during this summer will see the insurgency contained further and the Afghan National Security Forces ever more capable of providing enduring security to this region. I know the men and women in this Battlegroup are correctly trained for this mission and understand how it can be achieved; it is a privilege to be associated with such professionals."

The Army Welfare Service recently teamed up with English Heritage to create a project called "Tidworth: a changing town" for a group of young people at Ordnance House.

The group took photos of Tidworth and compared them with older photos supplied by English Heritage. They also visited Tidworth House and English Heritage funded a special sunrise visit to Stonehenge and a visit to the City of Bath for



them. Their work was

displayed for a month in the library at the TLC and they hope it will be displayed in other places in the future.



Illegal Off-Roaders Beware !

Ministry of Defence Police have been out in force on Salisbury Plain, tackling the problem of vehicles driving illegally across the Defence Training Area. The MDP has teamed up with Wiltshire Police, the RMP, Training Area Marshalls and Landmarc Land Wardens for the action.

On a recent Sunday, a total of 35 vehicles were checked, leading to 12 people being issued with fines and one motorcycle seized for being ridden without insurance.



"The vast majority of Salisbury Plain is owned by the MOD and it is regularly used for military exercises", said Sgt Mark Venning, the senior MOD Police officer for Salisbury Plain. "The public is allowed access and vehicles are permitted, but only if they stick to the numerous marked byways and official tracks and they must be fully road legal, including insurance.

"No vehicles are allowed to leave these rights of way, primarily for range safety reasons, but unfortunately we have been receiving more and more reports of motorists and bikers going off-road.

"This is an operational military training environment so this clearly presents a safety issue, but there is also the fact that 20,000 hectares of grassland on the Plain have been designated a Site of Special Scientific Interest and a Special Area of Conservation. We have had reports that damage has been caused to this environment by these unauthorised vehicles and motorbikes driving across the grasslands and in the woods."

The recent crackdown is the first of a number of planned MDP operations to get the message across about illegal driving on the Plain.

"MOD land on Salisbury Plain is subject to a range of byelaws which are posted at all access points, so there is no excuse for ignorance," Sjt Venning continued.

"These byelaws also give us powers of arrest for certain offences and allow us to remove vehicles and other property if they are being misused."

Olympic Torch Celebrations

The journey of the Olympic torch around the country began at Land's End on 19th May with triple sailing gold medallist, Ben Ainslie, the first torchbearer.



By Tuesday 22nd May the torch had reached Frome where it was carried by Sgt Gavin

Harvey, who served with 6 Bn REME in Tidworth and is currently with 43 (Wx) Bde Personnel Recovery Unit. "Absolutely epic!" he said. "The crowds were amazing and it was a really good turnout. I am so proud to have my wife and children here to see me. I am just proud to be here".

On 11th July, the torch will pass through Ludgershall, Tidworth, Amesbury and Salisbury, on its way to the Olympic Games. Tidworth plans a day of celebrations :
