The Vikings have arrived !



SOLDIERS from the 1st Battalion, the Royal Anglian Regiment, ("The Vikings"), raised their flag in Picton Barracks in Bulford for the first time on 9 Dec 2011.

"This is a special day for the battalion", said Commanding Officer, Lt Col Mick Aston MC. "It's great to be here and the soldiers and families are getting to know their way around the facilities of the garrison and the Salisbury area."

Although the move from Pirbright has taken place during a busy training period, the soldiers of 1 R ANGLIAN now live in some of the most modern housing available to service personnel and they are delighted.

"The rooms are pretty much amazing here, they are well-furnished and you have your own space. I've never had anything like it!" said Pte Robert Kedar of B Company.

The 1st Battalion The Royal Anglian Regiment - (The Vikings) is part of 12 Mechanised Brigade. The Battalion recruits from Norfolk, Essex, Suffolk and Cambridgeshire and its nickname, 'The Vikings', comes from the ferocious raiders that struck East Anglia and other parts of the UK during the Dark Ages. Members of the Vikings wear the Red and Yellow 'Minden' Flash on their right arms. This commemorates their proudest battle honour; the Battle of Minden, fought on 1st August 1759 during the Wars of Spanish Succession.

In the last 6 months the Battalion has been conducting Mission Specific Training for potential future operations. As well as the usual infantry skills such as fitness, navigation, shooting and medical training, personnel have been undertaking driver & vehicle crew training, counter-IED drills and cultural awareness.

The Battalion last went on tour on Op HERRICK 11 in 2009/10, when they deployed three rifle companies to support Task Force Helmand under 11 Light Brigade, taking part in Op MOSHTARAK. Prior to this, the Battalion deployed on Operation HERRICK 6 (Afghanistan 2007) and Operation TELIC 6 (Iraq 2005).



Analogue TV switch-off

Help is at hand to switch to digital TV. Digital TV switchover is the biggest change in television since the introduction of colour. In March 2012 analogue television will be switched off across Salisbury and some other surrounding areas. If you don't have digital TV by the time of switchover, you will lose your TV channels.



If you are still watching analogue TV (five channels or fewer) on any of your sets, you need to convert them to digital. Virtually any existing TV can be converted using a Freeview box, a digital satellite service or digital cable.

Almost everyone will be able to watch Freeview after switchover - even homes currently out of coverage. You can check the options for going digital in your area and what channels will be available through an aerial, using the postcode checker at www.digitaluk.co.uk.

If you're 75 or over or eligible disabled, the BBC-run Switchover Help Scheme will write to you directly and in plenty of time to ask if you want help. For more information on the Switchover Help Scheme visit www.helpscheme.co.uk or call free 0800 40 85 900.

Tidworth at the beginning of December when she officially opened the Academy's Applied Learning Centre located on the Castledown Business Park.

The Applied Learning Centre is a new venture in which pupils in years 9 - 12 can practise

carpentry, brickwork, plumbing and painting, gaining practical skills and experience while working towards a B Tec level 2 qualification in construction.

"We took on an empty shell of a building and what you see here is a testament to what these students have achieved", said Barry Seymour, Head of Construction at the Applied Learning Centre. "These are practical courses for non-academic students. They have learned science and maths in a practical way which has increased their motivation and, ultimately, their employability."

With the help of Plain Action, the Academy hopes to take on a further unit on the Business Park in order to open their courses to the community, including Service Personnel wanting to learn new skills before leaving the Army.

While in Tidworth, Claire Perry also spent some time with pupils and staff at Zouch Primary School and later took part in a lunchtime event at the Castledown Business Centre.

An Interview with Commander 43 (Wessex) Bde

Brigadier Hankinson assumed command of 43 (Wessex) Brigade in September 2011.

The Brigade is responsible for providing support, through 567 garrisons and stations, for all regular and Territorial Army units in the 7 counties of the South West of England.

The Brigadier commands three Territorial Army units, the Officer Training Corps of Exeter and Bristol universities, Army Cadet Force detachments, Combined Cadet Force contingents and is the director of the annual Ten Tors Challenge, a major event which takes place on Dartmoor for around 2,700 young people, including 300 who are disabled.

The Brigadier talked about the work of the Brigade :

"Defence's main effort is to support operations in Afghanistan", he said. "43 (Wessex) Brigade contributes to that through recruiting and support to the TA which is represented in every county, primarily through 6 RIFLES, the Royal Wessex Yeomanry and 155 Log Regiment.

"With the regular Army having to reduce by some 20% by 2020, (and that is a significant challenge in itself), to make up for that lack of capability, the Territorial force will be increased, fully trained and equipped. Studies are taking place, the 'Future Army 2020' and the 'Future Reserves 2020', to explore a new relationship between the Army, employers and individuals, which will be to the benefit of everyone concerned".

The Brigadier went on to talk about the Army's place in society, an area in which he is particularly interested and one which will become more important as troops return to this country from Germany.

"Twenty percent of the Army is based in the 43 Brigade area - some 20,000 soldiers and 42,000 dependants", he said. "In Wiltshire, the MoD is the largest employer - the scale is significant. Local Government recognizes the benefits and there are many local initiatives to bring everyone together in safer, stronger communities."

Initiatives in the areas of education, training, employment and business development, (for example: The Wellington Academy, Tedworth House and the Castledown Business Park), all help military children, spouses and those leaving the Army, particularly the injured, adjust to life outside the Army -- the Military Covenant in action.

43 (Wessex) Brigade is also the Tactical Headquarters for the conduct of UK operations in the Southwest; this could be a disaster or crisis in which local authorities require military assistance, for example the floods in Gloucestershire in 2007 and in Boscastle in 2004. Military assistance could be anything from air-sea rescue to soldiers providing sandbags or helping with the distribution of water or supplies.

One of the most exciting events on the calendar for 2012 is, of course the Olympics and 43 (Wessex) Brigade is

ready to do its part, working alongside the Navy in support of sporting events on the south coast.

"We are expecting clarity quite soon as to the role and scale of military involvement", the Brigadier concluded. "It's going to be an interesting year!"



New Year Honours

Congratulations to Captain Steve Harris from 4 RIFLES who was awarded an MBE in the New Year's Honours list.

Steve was given the Award in recognition of his work as Welfare Officer during one of the longest and toughest deployments his unit has undertaken.

He and his team looked after the families and extended families of deployed soldiers as well as those who had been injured and the families of the fallen.

"It was a busy time", he said. "While not neglecting the families around here, I was covering about 4000 miles a month, backwards and forwards to Headley Court and Selley Oak. We tried to get up there as much as we could and we'd always be there when one of our soldiers came back.

"This award isn't just for me, it is for everyone who was on Rear Party. I might have headed up the team but I had 7 other guys in the Welfare Office who worked tirelessly with me".

Steve will be presented with his Award later this month at Buckingham Palace.

New Year - New Department !

On 3 Jan 12, the legal office at HQ 3 (UK) Division extended its functions to take on discipline as well as operational law. This additional task entails the provision of legal advice to the Chain of Command in relation to



personnel in all areas of discipline, namely, Service Law, Warnings and Sanctions, Service Complaints and Service Inquiries.

The new legal office has grown in size from two lawyers to seven to cope with the anticipated

workload of approximately 1,000 cases a year and will reach full operating capability upon the arrival of three legal administrative staff in due course.

These changes to the provision of discipline advice are as a result of Project AVANTI.

A Traditional Farewell ...



On 15th December, all members of 2 R WELSH lined the route out of camp in order to say farewell to their Commanding Officer. As is tradition, he was towed out riding in a WARRIOR armoured fighting vehicle, with the Officers and Senior NCOs pulling the ropes.

Lt Col Didi Wheeler has been at the helm of the Battalion during a particularly busy two and a half years. He has watched each of the Rifle Companies deploy as individual sub-units to Afghanistan to act as the single Armoured Infantry Company and also seen the Fire Support Company deploy to the Falklands for a short tour as the Resident Infantry Company. More recently, the Battalion has taken on the role of Land Warfare Centre Battlegroup, which sees them deployed to a greater or lesser degree almost constantly. "Having spent much of the past 21 years serving with the Battalion, today is clearly a sad day for me to be moving on", he said. "However, it has been a privilege and an honour to have served alongside such fabulous Welsh Warriors - I wish them all the very best for the future."

The Battalion welcomed their new Commanding Officer, Lt Col Chris Barry, who took over command in January.

History repeating itself ...



Netheravon Station was built in 1911 and the majority of the buildings which remain on site today are Grade 2 Listed by English Heritage. Building 83 (pictured) was built originally as the soldiers' cookhouse and canteen facility and its story is about to come full circle: At the start of the Second World War, a new soldiers' cookhouse and canteen was built (Building 20) and Building 83 became the WOs' and Sgts' Mess, which had previously occupied Building 19. As West Camp at Netheravon Station moves towards being placed into suspended use, Building 83 will again be used as the soldiers' restaurant and bar for a short while, effectively returning to the use for which it was built 100 years ago!

2MI Bn leaves Netheravon



2MI Bn has moved from Netheravon across the Plain to a new home in Upavon - on foot! The move comes at the same time as the Battalion's role has also changed.



"We have ceased to be the Army's Counter Intelligence and Security Battalion and we've now become the Exploitation Battalion. Today, the march across the Plain was, in effect, to ceremoniously carry the flag from Netheravon across to Upavon and to raise it here, to let everybody know that 2MI Battalion is now in Upavon operating as an exploitation unit", Commanding Officer, Lt Col Mark Proctor told Drumbeat.

In their new role, the Battalion will be gathering forensic and electronic information in order to create a multi-dimensional picture of any given operational area.
