Tedworth House will be a Flagship ...

Help for Heroes, (H4H), now holds a lease on the building which, in partnership with the MOD, will become a Recovery and Assessment Centre for wounded, sick or injured soldiers.

While the Army is leading on helping the person to recover, H4H has plans to turn the house into a lifelong club for wounded soldiers, a 'one-stop-shop' for any of their needs, present or future.

Bryn Parry describes his vision for Tedworth House :

" A soldier coming here will become a member of our 'Band of Brothers' Club : there will be a cardiovascular gym, a ski-plex and sports nutritionalists, etc and he will be a member of that Club for life. When he leaves here and moves into society as a civilian, he leaves with the '7 pillars', if you like, of welfare, employment, psychological support, medical and so on, but can keep coming back to use the Club's facilities.

" There is going to be what I call a 'corridor of charities' in the house where charities like BLESMA, SSAFA, the Royal British Legion, the Soldiers' Charity, local Social and Employment Services, will all have a representative. Then if things start going wrong, the soldier can come straight back here. He doesn't have to ask who to turn to, he just says, "Right, these are my problems" .. and the charities stick their hands up and say "I'll take the legs, I'll take the psychological, I'll take the financial", or whatever it is.

" Since we began Help for Heroes in 2007, driving past Tedworth House, we've said wouldn't it be wonderful if we could have some of our wounded soldiers in there one day. And now we've started that process, we've got the keys and we're ready to go !"

Work has already begun, preparing the ground for the installation of specially-equipped temporary accommodation for the first wounded soldiers who will be arriving this June to start on their road to recovery. The remaining accommodation should be completed by Spring 2012, enabling 50 people to live at the house at any one time.

Roadworks in Tidworth

Wiltshire Council plan to redeck Tidworth 1st Bridge which lies on the A338 adjacent to the A3026 junction and The Ram Public House.



The work is programmed to commence in the first week of July and will last for approximately twenty weeks, although this is subject to confirmation as the design works progress.

The work will involve constructing a slight extension to the east side into which all of the utilities can be permanently diverted and then the original bridge (which lies under the A338) will be redecked one half at a time. Traffic will be controlled with three-way temporary lights. The new bridge will occupy the same footprint as the existing (with the addition of the aforementioned small widening to the east), with parapets similar to those used a few hundred metres to the south where the river turns back under the road.

However, what a great many of them will not be aware of is that they are eligible to become members of The Armed Forces Art Society.

The Society holds its annual exhibition at The Mall Galleries in London. This year the exhibition will run from 26 to 31 July 2011.

Anyone serving or who has served in the Armed Forces (including Reserve Forces and Cadets) or their spouse is eligible to apply to the Society. There are two types of membership, Associate and Full. The Committee will consider applications for Associate membership and will require samples of the artist's work in photographic form, via e-mail or details of the applicant's web site. Full Members are elected from those who have shown a consistent standard at the Society's exhibitions.

Children from Clarendon and Zouch Primary Schools recently enjoyed a concert featuring music from different countries performed by The Lucknow Band of the Prince of Wales's Division and guest ensembles. These included 19 Regt RA (The Highland Gunners), Fijians from the 2 R Welsh rugby team, the Gurkhas, Violinist Louise Bevan performing Irish folk tunes, Professor Singh performing on a traditional Indian Saranda and a Welsh choir. The concert began with some members of the Band dressed as 18th century Grenadiers, marching in to the auditorium to the British Grenadiers march, carrying a 'Jingling Johnny' - a musical instrument captured from the French during the Napoleonic Wars (1799 - 1815).

Digging up Plugstreet

Defence Estates Archaeologist on Salisbury Plain, Richard Osgood, (right) and his colleague, Martin Brown, have been nominated for an award by the magazine, 'Current Archaeology', for their research into the WW1 Anzac practice trenches on Salisbury Plain and then following the fortunes of the Australian 3rd Division over to the Western Front, near Messines in Belgium. They are pictured (above) in Belgium with the remains of the German pickelhaube helmet found, during the archaeological dig, amongst the possessions of Pte Alan Mather whose body was recovered from the battlefield where it had lain lost since 1917.

Other nominations included : a Neolithic dig in Orkney, Manchester in the industrial revolution, the Vikings and the Thames Discovery Programme. More news soon !



Targeting your Future

Do you want to further your education? Add to your skills base? Interested in promotion? Always fancied learning something new but never got around to it?

Standard Learning Credits (SLC) can help you improve your qualifications and are available for all regular serving members of the Armed Forces, including FTRS and MPGS.

SLC allows you to claim up to £175 per financial year towards 80% of education and training costs for as long as you are serving and for as long as the course is beneficial to you and the Service. You will pay a 20% personal contribution.

And there's more ...

You could also be eligible for up to £6000 of Enhanced Learning Credits (ELC). ELC are intended to support you in furthering your educational and vocational needs at a nationally recognised qualification of Level 3 and above.

How much ELC you are entitled to is dependent on time served. You can make up to three claims, up to 10 years post discharge from the Armed Forces, which means that ELC can be of great benefit during resettlement.

It may also interest you to know that if you use ELC in resettlement to achieve your first degree, you could get the rest of your tuition fees paid for you !

Christmas with the Welsh Warriors in The Falklands

Having worked with 2 Royal Welsh as Learning Development Officer since March 2010, I jumped at the opportunity to accompany Support Company when they



deployed to the Falklands as the Roulement Infantry Company (RIC) for two and a half months. A six week attachment to the Falkland Islands sounded like an

adventure, even though it meant spending Christmas and New Year 8000 miles from home!

I stepped from the aircraft after an eighteen-hour flight to be met by a fierce wind in my face and a clear black sky. The next day I became familiar with the environment I would be living and working in for the next six weeks. The facilities were fantastic, rivalling any offered by the large garrisons in the UK, including a large swimming pool, squash courts, a challenging climbing wall, a well equipped gymnasium, a cinema, a bowling alley, an internet suite - and even a golf simulator!

Mount Pleasant Camp is situated at the bottom end of the East Falkland Islands where a plethora of green corrugated-iron buildings covering an area larger than Tidworth Garrison, house the majority of the military units, from all three Services, based in the South Atlantic - including the Roulement Infantry Company. It was a new experience operating in an entirely tri-service environment.

Battlefield tours are a must for anyone visiting the Falkland Islands, offering an insight into the conflict which ended only twenty-eight years ago. The barren moors are still littered with debris, from Argentinian water bottles to spent British mortar casings.



Another must was the trip to Bertha's Beach, only a short drive from Mount Pleasant, to see the famous Falkland Island wildlife; I counted myself lucky we saw as much as we did. Walking down the long beach we saw several dolphins playing in the waves and as we sat on the beach colonies of Gentoo and King penguins struggled in the wind, very amusing to watch. In the air, 3 Turkey vultures circled the platoon, on the lookout for scraps of food.

I have brought away some fantastic memories from the South Atlantic, which include serving gunfire to the blokes on Christmas morning and receiving my second pip (together with an appropriate champagne fine from the OC soon afterwards!). The one thing which I will never forget, and this coming from a Scotsman, is the most unique weather system I have ever been exposed to. It was the first time I have been ordered to return to the accommodation during the day due to the wind and an incoming storm. Honestly, every season in one day!

Working together to keep Tidworth safe ...

On Friday 14th and 21st Jan 2011, Tidworth Neighbourhood Policing Team carried out multi-agency operations targeting two of the NPT's policing priorities. Patrolling alongside the NPT were members of the Ministry of Defence Police (MDP) based at Tidworth, Garrison Provost Staff, Royal Military Police (RMP) and Special Constables.

During both the evenings patrols were carried out both on foot and in marked vehicles. The aim was to prevent and detect anti-social behaviour in the Station Road area of Tidworth and to provide high visibility policing around the pubs and clubs. On 21st January, officers were joined on patrol by the passive drugs dog.

The operation was a success, with alcohol being seized from three under age youths who were issued with warnings for under age drinking. Operations like this will continue throughout the year.
