B (Rorke's Drift) Company from 2nd Battalion The Royal Welsh has returned home after a successful six-month tour in Afghanistan.

B Company deployed to Op HERRICK in July 2010 and has been assisting with the security and stabilisation programme in Helmand and Kandahar Provinces. Initially based in Helmand they were deployed in a ground-holding role near the Provincial Capital of Lashkar Gah. Around Christmas time they were re-tasked to provide security to the rebuilding of Highway 1 in Kandahar Province.

Highway 1 is a metalled road that provides vital communications throughout Afghanistan and B Company played a major part in this joint Afghan, UK and US repair project, working alongside the Afghan National Army and the Afghan National Police.

"2 R Welsh has had one of its Armoured Infantry Companies deployed for 18 of the past 24 months and being on an operational footing for that long has been a big strain on the boys and on the families too", Commanding Officer, Lt Col Didi Wheeler told Drumbeat. "It is a tremendous feat that they have all stood up to the plate and coped so well. I still have 10 soldiers deployed as augmentees with 16 Air Assault Brigade and when they get back it will be the first time the Battalion has been all together in two years".

After a well-deserved period of leave, preparations will begin for the Battalion's new role as the Land Warfare Centre Battalion, when they will be responsible for Force Development and the trialling of future kit. This will be a high profile role and one for which their operational experience will be invaluable. 2 R WELSH will take over the role from 1 RRF later this year.

A book focussing on the experiences of some of the wives of 2 R WELSH while their husbands were deployed has been written by Kitty Dimpleby, herself an Army wife who lives in this Garrison. All proceeds from Kitty's book will go to the charity, Help for Heroes, for which she works.





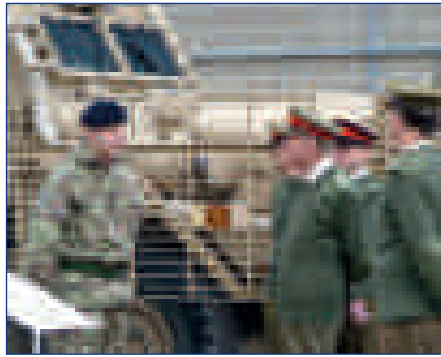
A Royal Visit to the REME

The Duke also had the opportunity to talk with soldiers and their families.

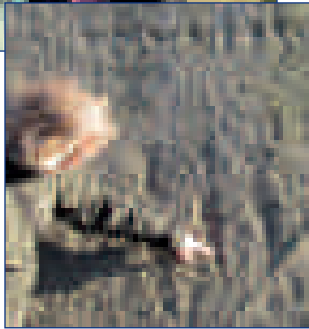

Visiting the Stones 'up close'



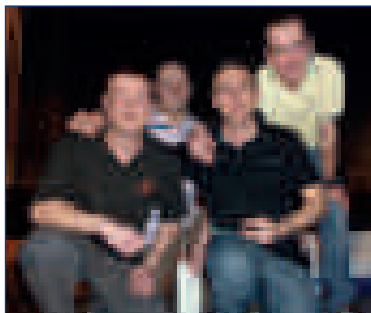

The show was opened by The Wellington Academy's Wind Band and performers from 'Our Boys Show' provided entertainment during the

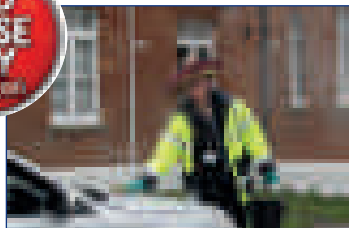
interval. Many thanks to everyone who helped make this another evening to remember !

John's ordeal contributed towards the £665.43 raised by Aspire Defence. Other activities included washing cars, leg waxing and a sponsored silence.

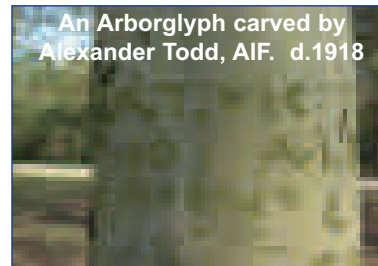

Archaeology on the Plain

In three years' time, it will be the centenary of the start of the First World War and, across Salisbury Plain, monuments survive which bear testament to the Great War. As with the current conflict in Afghanistan, training features were installed across the Plain to prepare soldiers for their impending travails in Belgium and France. Practice trenches can be seen across the training estate - and some of them are more pronounced and better preserved than those in the theatre that they were constructed to replicate !

These practice trenches recently formed the initial focus of the archaeological investigations of the 'Plugstreet Project' which has just been voted 'runner-up' in the national Current Archaeology Awards for Best Research Project 2011. The practice trenches north of the Bustard Inn were used initially by the Australian 3rd Division in readiness for the Battle of Messines, on which the Allied armies would embark in 1917. Training here went so far as to



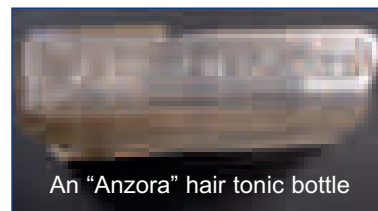
An Arborglyph carved by Alexander Todd, AIF. d.1918

replicate the detonation of a mine with 5000lb of gun-cotton - the prelude to the June attack in Messines was the blasting of 19 mines of huge magnitude. The names of the soldiers that trained for this attack can still be seen carved in the trees nearby. (Picture)

Following archaeology of the practice trenches the archaeological team, No-Man's-Land Archaeology, continued their research in Belgium at the site of the attack which the Australians had been training for. Here to the north of 'Plugstreet' Wood were the remnants of corrugated iron-

revetted Allied trenches and blasted German counterparts. The sites also yielded bottles, pipes and ration tins of the soldiers that had fought - and traces of the lives of civilians who had been forced to flee their farms.

The archaeological team also recovered the body of one of the soldiers who had trained on the Plain but who never returned to Australia. After a lengthy process of archaeological and scientific analysis, the soldier was identified as

Private Alan Mather from Inverell, an infantryman of the 33rd Battalion. He was laid to rest at Prowse Point Cemetery in July 2010 with the 7 closest members of his family, (a nephew, and 6 great nephews & nieces) travelling from Australia to be at the ceremony.

The archaeology project is run entirely by volunteers in their holidays, including the co-directors Richard Osgood and Martin Brown who work for Defence Estates.

120 members of 5 Armoured Engineer Squadron, 22 Engineer Regiment, were welcomed home to Perham Down on 17th March after a successful six-month tour providing engineering support to British, Afghan, Danish and American troops in Helmand province.

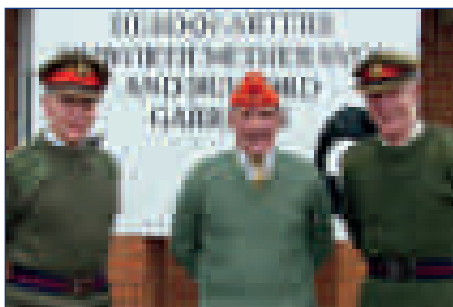
5 AES deployed to Afghanistan in September 2010 and has had a varied, busy and rewarding tour working in support of the Danish Battle Group in Nahr-e-Saraj and the 2 SCOTS Battle Group based in Lashkar Gah.

Their work also involved building new camps for British and Afghan soldiers, collapsing a large 300-man Danish Camp, and providing engineer support to infantry patrols across Helmand's 'Green Zone'. The Squadron was also responsible for providing armoured engineering support to the US Army based in Kandahar Province, for which five members of the Squadron received American meritorious awards.

Lt Col Jason Kerr, Commanding Officer of 22 Engineer Regiment, said, "It is a very special day for the Regiment to welcome home 5 Armoured Engineer Squadron. I am immensely proud of the Squadron's achievements and ... the professional and upbeat approach each soldier has maintained throughout the tour, often in the face of incredible adversity."

Speaking directly to the families of the soldiers, he thanked them for their support, saying, "This is a regimental family homecoming in all senses and a real celebration. Welcome home and a job well done!"

Operation Clean Sweep

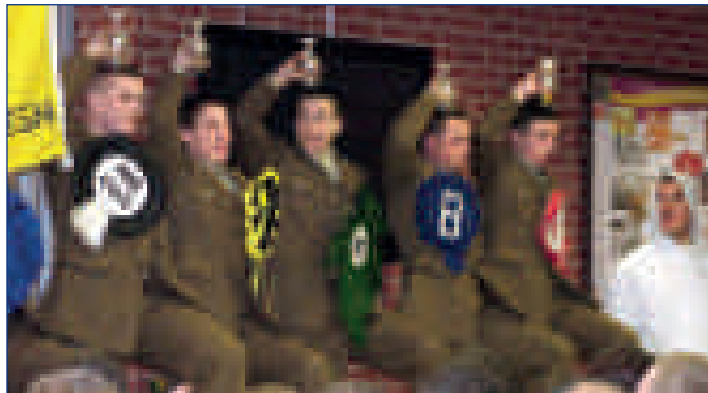
