Mission Ready Exercises on the Plain



Netheravon has been the base used by the Joint Helicopter Command for their Summer Aviation MRX on Salisbury Plain, Exercise Pashtun Jaguar.

Airfield Camp became "Camp Bastion" for the purpose of the Exercise as helicopter crews practised the kind of scenarios they will encounter when



they deploy to Afghanistan in September. Chinook, Lynx, Merlin and Apache aircrews have also been training alongside and providing air support for the 20 Armoured Brigade pre-deployment MRX, Exercise Pashtun Dawn.

Usually based in Germany, 20 Brigade has been practising for partnered and mentored operations in Afghanistan, for the first time using a purpose-built 'Afghan village' complex on the Plain.

"Ours will be the first Task Force to go into Afghanistan where transition of security is becoming a reality, not just something we are talking about", said Brigadier Patrick Sanders, the 20 Brigade Commander.

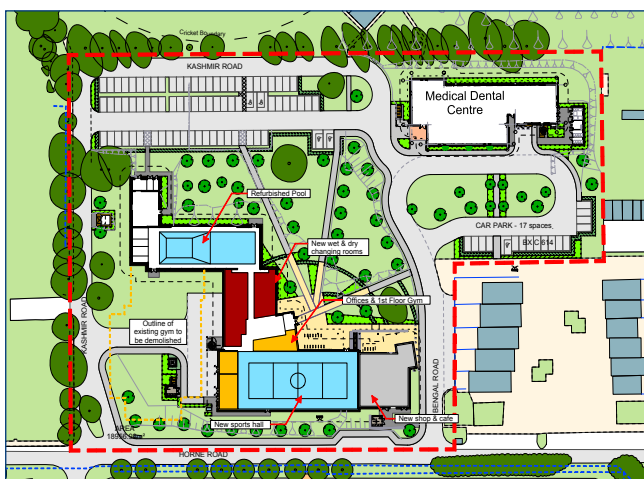

Coming Soon to Bulford ...

Hidden behind the trees on the edge of the Marlborough Playing Field, Bulford's new Medical & Dental Centre is taking shape and on track to be ready by next April.



The area outlined in red below, between Horne Road and Kashmir Road, is being redeveloped and will soon be the location for some spectacular new facilities for military personnel and their families.



The existing swimming pool will be refurbished and new changing rooms and offices built. A new military Sports Hall will also be constructed, roughly where the AWS offices used to be, in Horne Road. In a final phase of the work, a new shop, café and public toilets will be built at one end of the Sports Hall building, to replace the current Londis shop, which will then be demolished. The shops in the Bulford Precinct will be untouched.

The construction work has been organised in such a way as to allow the existing facilities to remain in operation as long as possible, in order that the need to find alternatives is minimised. There will be provision for 120 car parking spaces and the work will be completed by the end of 2013.

Army Under-23 Players help run Summer Football Course



For the past few years, a favourite Summer holiday activity in the Garrison area has been the children's football coaching week organised by Sgt Chalky Wiltshire, now a Welfare SNCO with 6 Bn REME.

Thirty-three children, from both military and civilian families, from as far afield as Amesbury, Andover and Poole, came along to Sipton Bellinger Village Centre to take part.

Chalky had enlisted the help of four other members of 6Bn REME to come along and help coach the children; many thanks go to Sgt Gribben, LCpl McCallum, and to Army Under-23 players, LCpl Bewick (Goalkeeper) and Cfn Meacham (Left Back).

The children took the FA Soccer Star Challenge and at the end of the week trophies were awarded to the best boy and the best girl in each age group, as well as to the best overall player throughout the week.

The children went home with a football, a kitbag, a drink bottle - and are all looking forward to being able to come back again next year !

Aspire's 'Big Challenge 2011'



The Human Resources team from Aspire Defence Services Limited has raised over £2,000 for the children's hospice, Naomi House, through their 'Big Challenge'. The 12-strong team decided they would mark Aspire Defence's fifth anniversary of delivering the MoD's Project Allenby/Connaught by raising funds for a worthy cause.

The 'Big Challenge' - walking the equivalent distance between Warminster and Aldershot, approximately 80 miles - was completed over two weekends, in two stages. The first stage was a 30-mile walk across Salisbury Plain, taking the Southern Transit Route that links Warminster to Tidworth. The second stage - the remaining 50 miles which is the equivalent distance from Tidworth to Aldershot - was sweated out using the gym equipment in the Tidworth Leisure Centre.

Kathryn Williams HR Director said, "Despite the driving rain during the first stage, the team completed the journey from Warminster to Tidworth with only a few blisters and aching limbs afterwards! Luckily the final stage indoors at the leisure centre was a bit more pleasant."

The team had initially set a target of £2,000 and thanks to people's generosity they have exceeded this amount and are still collecting sponsorship. The money will go towards the annual running costs of £5 million per year at Naomi House which provides hospice care for children and young adults with terminal illnesses. The HR team chose this charity as it offers support to families and young adults living in and around the same communities as the Army Garrisons it serves.

Working together produces Results ...

Tidworth has recently suffered a spate of burglaries from homes, sheds and garages. Property such as bicycles, satellite navigation systems, GPS devices, computers, tools, generators, phones, cameras, MP3 players and other items have been stolen.



As a result of an intelligence led operation, three warrants were carried out in Tidworth on Friday 15th July.

Officers from Wiltshire Police, the Ministry of Defence Police and the Royal Military Police recovered approximately 90 items of suspected stolen property which included a large proportion of goods as mentioned above.

During the operation three local men aged 16, 17 and 21 years were arrested on suspicion of burglary and were subsequently released on police bail pending further enquiries.

"This was a successful operation and enquiries are ongoing to reunite the recovered property with the rightful owners", said Sergeant Mark Freeman from Wiltshire Police. "Burglaries have a significant impact on victims and we hope that this excellent result highlights to the community our commitment to tackling such crimes. We ask that any suspicious behaviour is reported to us because it might just save someone else from becoming a victim."

Protect your Property ...

It is important to take measures to help prevent thefts and burglaries. Here are some things you can do :

- Keep front and back doors locked at all times - even when you are at home or in the garden. Around 25% of burglaries are through unlocked doors or windows.
- Lock all windows and doors when you go out - even if it is only for a few minutes.
- If you open a window for air, make sure it is closed before you go out.
- Keep your house and car keys in a safe place. Make sure that they cannot be seen from outside the house and that they are out of sight, and reach, from cat flaps, letterboxes and downstairs doors and windows.
- Keep valuable items out of view at night.
- If you are out in the evening, make sure you leave a light on and close the curtains.
- If you do not have a house alarm, consider investing in one to improve your security.
- Never leave a shed or garage unlocked.
- Mark valuable items with a property marking system.

1RRF Medal Parade



Uncle and Nephew, Fusiliers Jordan and Anthony Franklin, were among the 38 soldiers from X Coy, 1st Battalion Royal Regiment of Fusiliers who received their Afghanistan

Operational Medals at a parade held on 4th August.

The soldiers deployed as part of 16 Air Assault Brigade on Operation HERRICK 13 between October 2010 and April 2011; they were Battle Casualty Replacements attached to 2 & 3 PARA, 2 & 5 SCOTS and the Brigade Reconnaissance Force (BRF).

Although 1RRF is an Armoured Infantry Battalion, the men of X Coy deployed as light-role infantry, demonstrating the Fusiliers' professionalism, skill and ability to adapt. While in Theatre, they worked in various Forward Operating Bases and Patrol Bases, conducting close combat patrols and familiarisation patrols in their area of operations.

Captain Matthew Selby, X Coy 2iC, served for five months as a Platoon Commander with B Company 5 SCOTS (part of the 2 PARA Battlegroup):

"I deployed in December 2010 and took over a platoon after its Platoon Commander was injured - it was certainly very daunting. I got to meet my Jocks two days before Christmas and the lads did their best to welcome me and make me feel part of the clan. We were living in a mud compound out in the Green-Zone and I learned very quickly from my Platoon Sergeant the lie of the land. There had been a strong insurgent presence and we were trying to win over the locals. Within two months they were happy we were there and understanding what we wanted to achieve. We opened a school there and we worked well with the Afghan National Army."



On the day of the parade, the Fusiliers were also celebrating 'Minden Day', the 252nd anniversary of the Battle of Minden in Germany - the first time that Line Infantry had beaten French Cavalry. To commemorate this event the soldiers on parade wore red and yellow roses alongside the red and white hackles in their headdress. After the parade, the heavy rain gave way to bright sunshine for an afternoon of Fusilier family fun, fancy dress and competitions on the Lucknow / Mooltan playing fields.

News from the Town Council

Following the meeting of 2nd August 2011

Rumour regarding Sarsen Housing :

The Mayor of Tidworth, Councillor Chris Franklin MBE, has written to Sarsen Housing, asking them what plans Sarsen has for the Tidworth area and what effect the Aster Group Re-structuring will have upon Tidworth residents. Sarsen has replied, saying :

"We can confirm with you that we have been undertaking a land evaluation project over the last twelve months looking at all our properties, and land across our whole stock. This project has looked at our homes, our garages, and land and assessed the suitability for redevelopment or potential sale. The project has included all three of our group companies: Sarsen, Testway, and Flourish. We can assure you that no decisions have been taken and at this stage there are no plans to demolish Forest & Juniper Court. I can also assure you that before any decisions are taken, a full consultation exercise will take place with our partners and stakeholders, with our customers at the forefront of this process. We have sent a letter to all residents at Forest and Juniper explaining there are no planned changes to their homes and reassuring them they will be fully involved in any decisions".

Vacancy for Councillor :

Following a recently co-opted Councillor's failure to return the legally-required Declaration of Acceptance of Office, there is now a vacancy on the Council to be filled. Anyone interested in becoming a Tidworth Town Councillor should contact the Town Clerk, Mrs C. Lovell.

Proposed Waste Transfer Sites :

The plan to locate a Waste Transfer Site near Wellington Academy has caused much local ill-feeling. The Town Council has therefore written to the Wiltshire Council Waste Site Allocation Consultation regarding its proposed location at Castledown Business Park or at Pickpit Hill. This letter concluded : "In summary, neither site is suitable for waste facilities and both should be removed from the Council's waste site allocation documentation".
