Smiles all round as the Bulford 220 project is completed



Quarters on Bulford's New Ward Road, Irish Estate and Australian Estate now have new kitchens, bathrooms, windows and heating systems. The gardens have also been provided with patio areas and new garden sheds. Defence Infrastructure Organisation (DIO) has worked with its housing partner Modern Housing Solutions (MHS) to deliver these refurbished homes.

Four families who will soon be moving in were presented with bouquets of flowers by Major General John Lorimer, GOC 3 (UK) Division. Two of the families were from 1 R ANGLIAN, the unit which will be moving to this Garrison from Pirbright over the next few months.

DIO and MHS have announced the start of a new joint approach to community projects, starting with a wild flower area near the Canberra Drive quarters and some work at The Beeches Community Centre where children's play equipment has been painted, the outside patio area cleaned and new sensory plants put into raised beds.

Archaeology aids Rehab



Injured soldiers have recently spent some time with DIO Archaeologists on Salisbury Plain examining Iron Age material at Chisenbury Midden dating from around 800BC. The soldiers, from 1RIFLES, used the opportunity to learn a series of excavation, land survey, drawing and mapping techniques but, just as important, it has helped them with their recovery from injury on operations.

"It relieves some of the day to day pressures you feel when you are stuck at home. It's helped a lot, not just mental issues but physical as well", said Cpl Steven Winterton. (Left).

"Some of the lads feel like they are pushed aside and are alienating themselves to a degree, so this is a good way of getting the blokes together, feeling like they are part of something again, physically and mentally as well", said Rfn Wayne Berny. (Right)

Archaeologist, Martin Brown (centre) said, "Troops on the Plain mostly see our stuff with the 'no digging' signs on it, so it is great to be able to tell them actually what some of these lumps and bumps are and why they are not allowed to train across that area because there is an awful lot of stuff going on beneath their feet which is really rather unusual".

"It's mind-blowing, you know, to see what comes out of the ground after thousands of years!", said Rfn Berny.

1RRF 3 Peaks Challenge

RSM WO1 Del Snelling recently led a team from 1 RRF on the 3 Peaks Challenge, in a bid to raise funds for the Bury Regimental Museum and the Fallen Fusilier Memorial.

The aim of the Challenge is to successfully climb the 3 largest peaks in the UK, including the drive between each one (without breaking the speed limit), all in 24 hours.

The 12-man team arrived at the foot of Ben Nevis on 23rd July, in time for the official start of the challenge at 1700hrs. The climb was physically demanding but greatly rewarding once they reached the summit at 4409 ft : the weather was perfect and the views across the various Scottish mountains and glens were superb.

The team then travelled to England, starting to climb the 3560 ft Scafell Pike at 0400hrs. In stark contrast to Ben Nevis, it was a damp morning with nothing much more than slate and rock to look at. This was the hardest of all three climbs, but the view from the summit of the sun rising over distant mountains made it all worthwhile. The climb and decent took just over 2 and a half hours.

Delayed by traffic on the M6, they did not arrive at Mt Snowdon until 1350hrs. The climb would have been much easier without the time pressure, but the faster members reached the 3209 ft summit on just over the hour mark. The whole team completed the challenge with 50 minutes or so to spare before the 1700hrs deadline !

The team raised £4075 for the Regimental Museum and Fallen Fusiliers Memorial.

Channel Swim raises funds for the Royal British Legion

The idea to do a relay swim across the English Channel in aid of charity was first conceived in the summer of 2010 by Majors Fergus Maguire and Oli Madders whilst serving at Medical Branch 3 (UK) Division.

Twelve months and many training sessions later, the swim took place this Summer, raising in the region of £6,000 for the Royal British Legion.



The Legion has been helping Service personnel for the past ninety years, most recently, by helping to

fund Personnel Recovery Centres.

3DSR Medal Parade

Soldiers from 3rd (United Kingdom) Division Headquarters and Signal Regiment, (3DSR), received their Afghanistan Operational Medals on 7 September, at a parade held at Picton Barracks in Bulford.



The medals were presented to the 150 soldiers by Major General Lorimer, General Officer Commanding 3rd (UK) Division, Brigadier Watts, Signal Officer-in-Chief and Group Captain Devlin, Acting Commander 11 Signal Brigade.

The Regiment deployed earlier this year as the first Campaign Signal Regiment, charged with delivering an improved communications system in Theatre. Four soldiers received GOC's Commendations for their part in the Project : Cpl Charnock, Cpl Deans, Cpl Macleod and L/Cpl Healey. General Lorimer also presented Sgt Wilson with an Accumulated Service Medal for over 1000 days spent on operations.

Lieutenant Colonel Greg Wilson, Commanding Officer 3 (UK) Division Headquarters and Signal Regiment said, "The Regiment's men and women produced sterling results under, at times, extremely demanding and austere conditions. I am immensely proud of the soldiers and officers for their professionalism, teamwork and the services they delivered both in bases across Helmand and on patrol in Kabul. It was a privilege to be their Commanding Officer on operations."



The parade was followed by a motorcycle display from the Royal Signals White Helmets and a Families Day which included a display by the Shrewton Dog Club.

3AES returns from Afghanistan

On 2nd September, soldiers from 3 Armoured Engineer Squadron, 22 Engineer Regiment, were welcomed back to Perham Down by their families, friends and colleagues after a successful four-month tour of Afghanistan.

The Squadron deployed to Afghanistan during early May 2011 and was attached to 24 Engineer Regiment (Commando), normally based in Chivenor, Devon. The Squadron had a varied, busy and rewarding tour working in numerous locations across Helmand Province.

Major Matt Davies Officer Commanding 3 Armoured Engineer Squadron said: "We have been out in Afghanistan for four months on a purely construction tour. What we have been doing is expanding some of the

base locations and providing more facilities. It is not very glamorous work a lot of the time, but actually the guys and girls really do appreciate it. They go from pouring cold buckets of water over themselves to having proper heated showers. It means a lot in those conditions. Our role is not as dangerous as the infantry by any means but we are there to make their lives easier, making it more relaxing and taking some of the pressure off when they are back in these camps before they go back out again on patrol.



"I would like to say thank you to the Squadron for their ability to work relentlessly in the heat and the dust ... I am very proud of them."

The soldiers from 3 Armoured Engineer Squadron will take a period of post-operational leave before returning to normal military training on Salisbury Plain.
