A Royal Visit to 4 RIFLES

The Duchess of Cornwall visited 4 RIFLES on 18th November. After laying a wreath at their Memorial to the Fallen, the Duchess inspected the JNCO Cadre Pass Off Parade and presented the Harding Cane to the top student, Rifleman Nathan Bennett.



The JNCO Cadre is a challenging course which Riflemen have to pass before they can be promoted to Lance Corporal. Lieutenant Colonel Nick Thornton, Commanding Officer 4 RIFLES, explained :

"One hundred and fifty soldiers started the selection week and just sixteen will be promoted from Rifleman to Lance Corporal as a result of the parade today. So this shows how big a hurdle it is for them to get over and it is a really important first step in their Army careers.

"It was tremendous to have the Duchess come and take the parade, as it made it into a really special event for those young men who were actually parading and indeed for all the families who came along to support them."

It was a proud moment for Rfn Bennett,, whose parents were among those watching the parade :

"It is a big transition going from Rifleman to Lance Corporal and being a Non-Commissioned Officer. It is a big step taking command and stepping up from your peers and directing instead of being directed", he said.

After the parade, the Duchess went on to open the new Sergeants' Mess where she presented 7 Long Service and Good Conduct medals and joined a reception for those who had been on parade and their families.

Around a thousand runners took part in the 7th annual 10K & 3K fun run held in Tedworth Park on 6th November to raise money for the Salisbury Hospital Stars Appeal. Many runners, whether military or civilian, young or old, had a special reason to take part, wanting to 'give something back' or just to say 'thank you' to the hospital from which they had received help. Runners could choose which area of the hospital's work they wanted to support, for example the Cardiac suite, the Pembroke Unit, the Stroke Unit or the Stars Appeal's current major project to help fund family accommodation which will be attached to a new special care baby unit.

Many thanks to the team of volunteers from 1st (Mech) Bde and Sig Sqn (215) led by RSM WO1 Dean Cartledge, for their help organising the event. The challenging 10k course began in Tedworth Park and covered areas of Salisbury Plain including Sidbury Hill. There was also a 3k run around the polo pitches for under-16s.

Gemma Heath from the Stars Appeal said, "We are so grateful to .. everyone who supported this event. We hope to have raised over £30,000 to help fund important projects that benefit local people who receive care at Salisbury District Hospital."

The focus of the Project Allenby Connaught construction programme is now firmly on Bulford where 4th Battalion The Rifles have occupied their refurbished accommodation in Ward Barracks and by Christmas 1st Battalion the Royal Anglian Regiment, the last major unit to join

the Garrison, will be resident in Picton Barracks. The building of the new medical and dental centres, gym and swimming pool are well underway and include a café and replacement for the Londis shop, which will bring a much needed focus for our families living on the Bulford patches.

The year has also seen the opening of the Personnel Assessment and Recovery Centre in Tedworth House, a partnership between Help for Heroes and the MoD. It is a truly remarkable facility and fitting use for such a magnificent building. In Ludgershall, Wellington Academy was formally opened by HRH The Duke of York in October and is gaining a well deserved reputation for its outstanding facilities and academic achievements. It is well placed to support military families with its boarding house and I have no hesitation in recommending it to prospective parents.

Next year will bring more challenges as 12 Mechanized Brigade deploys to Afghanistan and 1 Mechanized Brigade prepares to follow in 2013. It will be beholden on the rest of us to provide those deploying and their families with all the support and assistance they rightly deserve.

May I wish you all a very happy Christmas, especially those who cannot be with family and loved ones and those deployed in foreign lands. I hope you also have a very happy New Year.

at short notice. They will soon resume Mission Ready Training, preparing for possible deployment in 2013.

1Bn The Royal Regiment of Fusiliers held

a Service of Dedication and Remembrance on 11th November at their new Fallen Fusiliers Memorial Garden which has been constructed in Mooltan Barracks.



The Garden commemorates all Fusiliers who have lost their lives since the formation of the Regiment on St George's Day in 1968.

Consisting of engraved plaques of mahogany and brass mounted on a pine-clad wall, the Memorial is located in the heart of the barracks where Fusiliers will see it every day. At the centre of the garden is The Turrington Bell, named in memory of Fus Kelan Turrington who was killed in Basra in April 2003.



The memorial has been funded by money raised within the Regiment, together with some local donations, and it has been designed and built with help from Aspire Defence

Capital Works.

The service of dedication and remembrance was attended by several of the bereaved families.
