

Theatre Troops on the Move

Headquarters Theatre Troops held its last parade at Airfield Camp in Netheravon on 23rd September, before moving to Trenchard Lines in Upavon.



Major General Bruce Brealey, GOC HQ Theatre Troops, addressed the military and civilian staff assembled outside the Headquarters building before the flag was lowered by Charlie Smith, the longest-serving Civil Servant at the Headquarters.

HQ Theatre Troops commands the 34,000 military personnel across the British Army who provide support to combat troops

on

operations, described by Major General Brealey as "the glue which keeps the fighting formations supplied with all that they need to fight, from postmen to surgeons, from unmanned aerial vehicles to dog handlers and from port operators and railwaymen to bomb disposal".



Farewell ...

The King's Royal Hussars bade a fond farewell to their civilian typist, Mrs Gudrun Riley, at the beginning of September. Her retirement marked the end of 23 years

distinguished service, during which she worked within six different Regimental Headquarters in Tidworth. All have found her to be a delight to work with and essential to the smooth running of the unit.

'Gudders,' as she was widely known, started



work with the Royal Scots Dragoon Guards in Bhurtpore Barracks on 1st June 1987. She subsequently worked with the Royal Hussars (Prince of Wales's Own), the 17th / 21st Lancers, the Queen's Royal Lancers, the Royal Dragoon Guards and the King's Royal Hussars. She also served for a period in Upavon at the Command Secretary's outer office. It has not been all work, however, and Gudders has had opportunity to drive both Challenger 1 and 2 tanks, fire rifles on the Bulford Range complex and to meet Her Majesty the Queen.

Her retirement was marked with a celebratory lunch in the Officer's Mess and the presentation from the Commanding Officer of the King's Royal Hussars, Lieutenant Colonel Alex Potts.

Operational Honours for Garrison Soldiers

The list of Operational Honours and Awards for Op HERRICK 11 was announced on 24th September, with several Servicemen from this Garrison among those receiving awards and decorations for actions during the period October 2009 to March 2010 when they were deployed as part of 11 Light Brigade. Most were based near Sangin in Helmand Province, where they faced some of the most concentrated attacks and highest casualty rates in Afghanistan to date.

Cpl Ricky Fergusson, 4 RIFLES, has been awarded an MC for repeatedly going to the aid of wounded comrades in four different incidents, actions which saved their lives, before he himself was struck by an IED, losing both his legs and an eye.

"Cpl Fergusson represents all that is best in a Rifleman ..." said Commanding Officer, Lt Col Nick Thornton. "It is a mark of the man that he has worked to overcome his injuries with the same fortitude that he has always shown and the award of the MC is a fitting testament to a brave and indomitable spirit. We are immensely proud of him".

Rfn Reece Terry, 4 RIFLES, then only 18, has been awarded the Queen's Gallantry Medal for Bravery (QGM). He was the lead man checking for IEDs, across extremely perillous terrain, during a stealthy night-time operation in Helmand which resulted in the capture of an enemy leader and six others, together with a large number of weapons and IED parts. His citation reads, "What Terry achieved on that night was unimaginable prior to the event ... shifting the boundaries of the possible in the minds of his fellow Riflemen".

The late **Rfn Ross Robinson**, 4 RIFLES, has been awarded an posthumous QGM. Following an IED explosion, he ignored his own injuries, continuing to clear a safe path to the casualties, administering first aid and helping to lift them into a helicopter. Back in camp, it was realised that Rfn Ross had spinal injuries which required immediate evacuation to the UK for treatment. Tragically, he was killed on the A303 near Bulford, just 24 hours after he was discharged from the Defence Rehabilitation Centre at Headley Court. This picture of him with his baby daughter has been supplied by his family.

Major Richard Streatfeild, OC A Coy 4 RIFLES has been awarded an MBE and three other members of 4 RIFLES, (Lt Charles Winstanley, WO2 Patrick Hyde and Cpl Steven Martin), have received a Mention in Despatches, the oldest form of recognition of gallantry within the Armed Forces. Rfn Peter Matthews has been awarded the Queen's Commendation for Bravery, (QCB).

Lt Col Nick Thornton, Commanding Officer of 4 RIFLES said, "We are all incredibly proud of the courage shown by all members of A Company in Sangin, and these awards highlight their extraordinary achievements. That they fall



across the ranks is testament to their shared sense of purpose and the injuries sustained by some recipients demonstrate the sacrifice that all were willing to make. We are proud of them all".

Mention in Despatches has also been awarded to **Sgt Paul Howard**, 2RTR, **LCpl Alex Jones**, 2 R WELSH and to **LBdr Craig Froggett**, 1RHA.

WO2 Justin Searle, 1RHA, has been awarded the Queen's Commendation for Valuable Service (QCVS).

We all know that the World's resources are finite and that the world we live in is directly affected by the actions of mankind.

We, as present custodians of the planet, have a duty to future generations to use these finite resources in a SUSTAINABLE way, in order that there are some left for our children and our children's children.



This new monthly slot in Drumbeat will give a few tips on how we can all do more to help the Planet by:

- Cutting down on waste
- Saving Energy
- Looking after the environment

Starting with: Waste Management

Every year, the UK produces over 430 million tonnes of waste and, despite increased recycling rates, nearly 60% of this waste still goes to landfill. Landfill space is limited and current sites will be full within the next 10 years. Therefore, reducing the amount of waste going to landfill is a NATIONAL PRIORITY.

The Garrison and its main contractor, Aspire Defence, in partnership with Hills Waste, the Local Authority waste disposal company, have been working together since the

beginning of the year to improve waste management and increase recycling rates. We are now able to collect and recycle cardboard, paper, plastic and cans in the "Red Top Recyclers", which are provided outside all relevant buildings. As a

result, recycling rates have steadily increased and are expected to improve still further.

What next? Coming soon to offices in the Garrison:

The next stage is to extend the service to INSIDE office buildings, where most waste should be recyclable. Centralised recycling facilities will be provided at points



within your building where you will be able to segragate your waste into recyclable and non-recyclable bins. These bins will be emptied by Sodexo and the waste deposited into the appropriate Hills receptacle.

Celebrations at the TLC

The TLC celebrated the 10th Anniversary of its opening on 26th August and marked the occasion with a day of special events. Stuart McLean, pictured above outside the main entrance to the Leisure Centre, has been involved in managing the TLC since it opened in 2000.

"I am very proud to have been responsible for the TLC for 10 years, in which we have seen 2,000,000 customers pass through

the doors", he told Drumbeat. "We have been supported most positively by our partners, Wiltshire Council, the Wiltshire and Army Library Services and the Army Welfare Service. The TLC was the first Army leisure centre to be available to the local community as well as to members of the garrison and it has been hugely successful.
