The final 4 events were the 10km cross country run, kabaddi, tug of war and the superstars event. Various other events had taken place throughout the year and included swimming, football and rugby to name but a few. Each of the competing units fielded a team in each discipline with the exception of 158 Pro Coy RMP who, due to operational commitments, were forced to field just one team that competed in all 4 events! The day was a great

success and thoroughly enjoyed by all competitors and spectators alike, particularly the kabaddi, which drew in some large crowds especially as the event seemed to get more and more physical as the competition advanced ! The overall 'Festival of Sport Champions' went to 2 RTR who put



in some fantastic performances throughout the day to take the trophy by a very narrow margin from 3 Log Sp Regt RLC, whilst the overall champions of the Commander's Cup for 2010 went to 4 RIFLES, (picture), who beat their nearest rival, 6 CS Bn REME, by a handsome 10 point margin.

We now look forward to the Commander's Cup 2011 which will welcome back HCR, 1 Coldstream Guards and 1RHA following their HERRICK deployments this year, which will make it more competitive than ever !


## Know your Vehicle : 1RRF conduct Driver Training

Recognising that road traffic accidents account for more deaths, injuries and damage than any other activity undertaken by soldiers both on and off duty, members of 1Bn The Royal Regiment of Fusiliers have been given off-road Safe Driving training, organised by the Motor Transport WO, WO2 Jim Kenworthy.

Over 100 soldiers from the Unit received expert tuition from professional off-road instructors who taught them how to drive across ditches and how to ascend and descend the steep inclines on the Salisbury Plain Training Area.

"To make sure these guys drive safely and effectively, we must make sure we give them the right training," WO2 Kenworthy told Drumbeat. "This event has given our young and inexperienced drivers an opportunity to learn how to use the ever-varying types of 4x4 vehicles in a manner that not only improves their ability to drive safely but also reduces the amount of damage caused to these vehicles through poor driving skills".

"Road safety is normally a slightly dull subject, but everyone who completed this training has been smiling, so I hope they will remember what they have learnt. If this training results in one less accident then the event will have been a success!"



## 2RTR prepares to deploy

Over 300 soldiers and officers from 2nd Royal Tank Regiment who will be deploying to Afghanistan in September and October took part in a Regimental Day in Tidworth on Saturday 31 July.



It was an opportunity for their families and friends to see the whole Regiment on parade and look at the vehicles the soldiers will be using when they are in Afghanistan.

Three of 2 RTR's four Sabre Squadrons are to be deployed on Operation HERRICK 13 with 16 Air Assault Brigade. 'BADGER' will provide the Viking Armoured Vehicle Group with around 90 men and is due to leave in October. 'CYCLOPS' and 'FALCON', also with approximately 90 soldiers each, are due to deploy in the middle of September to provide the Mastiff groups. The Regiment will also provide officers and soldiers to fill key staff roles in Camp Bastion and the Task Force HQ in Lashkar Gar.

The deploying soldiers have spent the last year training on the Vikings and Mastiffs which are very different to their usual Challenger 2 tanks. They will swap their distinctive traditional black coversalls for the new camouflage pattern combats as soon as they return from some well-earned summer leave.



## You're in the Army now !

On 26 September, the legendary rock band, Status Quo, will be re-releasing a new version of one of their hits from the 1980s, with profits from all sales going to two military charities, the "British Forces Foundation" and "Help for Heroes".



The original song, "In the Army Now", was first released in 1986



and reached no.2 in the charts. The 2010 version has updated lyrics and features singers from the Corps of Army Music.

Francis Rossi said, "It seemed like the right time to do this. This release is intended to show our support for the Allied Forces around the world, but in particular, of course, the British Armed Forces. We want people to celebrate what they do, say thank you and also support these vital charities."

Colleague Rick Parfitt added: "We've even roped in the Army to create a stunning video that will really give the song some heavy firepower!"

The video was recorded earlier this Summer with the help of 4 RIFLES, in Kiwi Barracks in Bulford and at the Tank Museum at Bovington.

Also at the Families' Day was Captain Hamish Reid, the Regimental Medical Officer who, with friend and fellow Army Medic, Captain Nick Dennison, entered the record books this Summer for being first to circumnavigate the UK in a rowing boat, a distance of over 2100 miles. As well as using their expedition as an opportunity to raise money for military charities, they also gathered statistics for research into the calorific demands of prolonged exertion, similar to work done by polar explorer, Ranulph Fiennes. This is an increasingly important component of current operations.

## Ex PASHTUN EAGLE

HQ 1 Mech Bde has recently returned from Ex PASHTUN EAGLE, a three week exercise on Salisbury Plain designed to put each of 16 Air Assault Brigade's Battle Groups through their final paces before deploying on Op HERRICK 13 in September/October this year. HQ 1 Mech Brigade wrote the exercise in tandem with HQ 16 Air Assault Brigade and then ran the exercise on their behalf. This left time for HQ 16 Air Assault Brigade to conduct numerous alternative scenarios whilst the exercise was being run.

Ex PASHTUN EAGLE consisted of a series of high intensity 7 day cycles for all Battle Groups and, with some name changes, the scenario was pretty much the same as the current situation in Helmand Province. Realism was added to the exercise by Afghan locals and interpreters and



by holding the Exercise in urban areas similar in design and layout to those in Theatre.

The exercise was a tremendous success, allowing 5 Battle Groups to bring all their skills and drills together under one umbrella before deploying later this year.

Elements of 1 Mech Brigade that will be deploying with 16 Air Assault Brigade include sub units from 2 RTR, HCR, 2 R WELSH, 2 SCOTS, 22 Engr Regt and 3 Log Sp Regt RLC. We wish them all a safe and successful tour.

**Plainwatch** is specifically designed to rapidly identify any suspicious or even criminal activity on the Plain and, in the longer term, to deter it.

We seek the support of anyone who regularly uses the Plain for recreational purposes who, when doing so, spots what could be termed suspicious or criminal activity taking place.

If you spot a vehicle fly tipping or acting suspiciously, report it to this 24-hour telephone number :

with as many details as possible. for example :

- Date
- Time
- Location

( if not a grid reference, then as much information as possible, eg East, Centre or West, plantation name, tank crossing number, farm or training feature name. )

- What or who were seen, vehicle registration number
- What were they doing that caused concern
- Your own contact details : tel no, address etc.

Do not approach any potential offenders or enter into a confrontation, but merely report what you have seen from afar. Your evidence may be needed by the Police.

We would welcome your assistance in making the Plain more secure and a safe place to enjoy.

The money it costs the Defence Training Estate to clear up fly-tipped material is money that can't be spent on training soldiers ... which could ultimately COST LIVES on operations.

### Katia jumps for Soldiers' Charity

A volunteer from Storybook Soldiers has made a tandem skydive at Netheravon, to raise money for ABF The Soldiers' Charity. Katia Kidds, who has been a Storybook Soldiers Editor for two years, jumped from 13,000 ft with The Tigers, the parachute display team of The Princess of Wales's Royal Regiment.

Storybook Soldiers helps soldiers record bedtime stories for their children so they can listen to Daddy, or Mummy, reading to them while he/she is away on operations. More than 3,000 soldiers have taken part in the project so far, which now has parallel schemes in the Royal Navy and Air Force. The Volunteers edit the story, adding sound effects and music before putting it onto a CD; they then send this very unique gift to the soldier's children.

The scheme is supported in part by The Soldiers' Charity; one of its directors, Kirsty Alderson, explained why the grant has been essential to their work: "We have employed an administrator, and bought more equipment such as the laptops and software the editors use. The families are delighted and extremely grateful to the editors and the work of Storybook Soldiers".

Katia took to the skies along with dozens of others, to raise vital funds for the Soldiers' Charity. "I'm excited and scared at the same time!", she said. My husband is in the Army so this is the charity which is closest to my heart. A few months ago I met some soldiers who'd been wounded in Afghanistan and they really inspired me."
