Temporary Road Closure in Bulford

To enable Bulford bridge replacement works, a section of road is to be temporarily closed, as follows :

A3028 Bulford Hill (part), Durrington and High Street (part); from a point adjacent Nags Head Cottage vehicular access (Bulford Hill) Durrington for a distance of approximately 125 metres in an easterly direction to a point adjacent Old Mill Cottage vehicular access (High Street) Bulford. The closure will be clearly indicated by traffic signs throughout the works period.

Alternative Route - Eastbound Vehicles : Via A3028 (Bulford Hill, Larkhill Road) Durrington, A345 (Countess Road) A303T (Eastbound), A303 (Eastbound slip off at Solstice Park to C32 Tisbury Road), C32 (Tisbury Road, Salisbury Road), A3028 High Street (Part) Bulford.

Alternative Route - Westbound Vehicles : Via A3028 High Street (Part) Bulford, C32 (Salisbury Road, Tisbury Road, Porton Road), Solstice Park Avenue to A303 west slip, A303T (Westbound), A345 (Countess Road), A3028 (Larkhill Road, Bulford Hill) Durrington.

The Order comes into force on Tues 4 May 10 and it is anticipated the work will take until 30 Oct 10 to complete. The Order will have a maximum duration of 18 months.

Soldiers from 4 RIFLES return from Afghanistan



Soldiers from A Company 4th Battalion The Rifles returned to Bulford last month after a successful but extremely intense and sometimes tragic six-month deployment in Afghanistan.

Based in the Sangin District of Northern Helmand and commanded by Major Richard Streatfeild, A Company was part of 3 RIFLES Battle Group. The soldiers played a key role in Operation Moshtarak and were located predominantly in Forward Operating Base Inkerman and the surrounding recently built Patrol Bases, to extend the area of security and stability around the population centres.

The joy of waiting families and friends was tinged with sadness knowing that five members of A Company were killed during the deployment. They are: Lance Corporal Tom Keogh, 24, who died on 7 March; Rifleman Carlo Apolis, 28, on 1 March; Rifleman Martin Kingett, 19, on 25 February; Rifleman Peter Aldridge, 19, on 22 January; and Rifleman Samuel Bassett, 21, on 8 November 2009.

Major Streatfeild said, "We do not confuse taking casualties with a losing battle. Every one is a tragedy for families, friends and comrades. To a man they died fighting for their friends and doing the job they volunteered for."

14 Armd Coy arrives home



14 Armoured Coy, 6 Close Support Bn REME, has for the last 6 months served as part of 104 Theatre Equipment

Support Group in Afghanistan on Op Herrick 11. The Company returned to the UK to a fantastic reception from family and friends in the (very) early morning of the 11th April, after an extremely busy and challenging tour.

The Tidworth based 135 strong company consists of several trade disciplines - vehicle mechanics, armourers, electronics technicians, metalsmiths, recovery mechanics, and technical stores staff, all of whom are responsible for the maintenance, inspection and modification of the myriad of equipments used by the Armed Forces on operations in Afghanistan. Throughout the tour, the men and women of the Company have worked long hours in order to ensure that the front line troops have the maximum amount of serviceable equipment available to them.

It has been a busy year for the Company, with 6 months of intensive training prior to deployment, followed by 6 months away from family and friends; it is safe to say that all personnel are delighted to be home in time for the summer.

"I am enormously proud of the whole Company's achievements and I am honoured to have commanded such a great team", said Maj Liz Faithfull-Davies, Officer Commanding 14 Armoured Company.

1RHA returns home



"The last 12 months have been emotional, demanding and great fun for 1RHA in roughly equal measure" said Commanding Officer, Lt Col Jez Bennett. "We converted the regiment from an armoured regiment with AS90 to a light role regiment with Light Gun and dismounted fire controllers (Fire Support Teams - FSTs). This required a change of mindset as much as a change of equipment ... and the boys and girls took to it like ducks to water."



The transition took a full 12 months. Exercise GRAND PRIX in Kenya marked the point they became fully integrated with their new Brigade - 11 Light Brigade - and a Confirmatory Field Exercise (CFX) at the new mock-up village in Norfolk, complete with real Afghans, real animals and realistic buildings, replicated the sights, smells and complexities they would find in Afghanistan.

1RHA played a key role in the recent Operation Moshtarak as the lead unit for the Joint Fires and ISTAR Group (JFIG) throughout Helmand Province. Fire Support Teams from the Regiment deployed on the ground in every Task Force and battle Group-level operation that took place during the tour. The Gun Groups were based in forward Operating bases and in some of the most austere patrol bases and check points, with Regimental Headquarters based in Lashkar Gah.

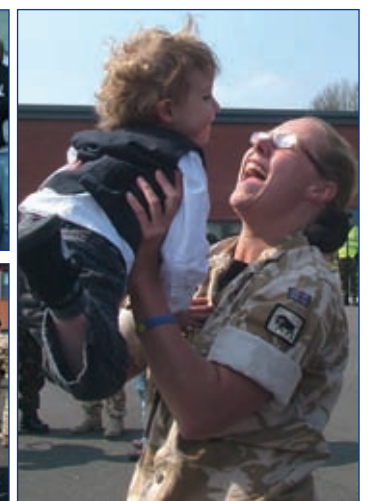
The soldiers also continued to train and mentor the Afghan National Army's artillery, enabling them to fire for the first time in support of the international Security Assistance Force (ISAF). In addition, members of B Battery were involved in setting up the interim Helmand Police Training Centre in Lashkar Gah.

Now the Unit is back in Tidworth, the team of 15 Australians who have been with 1RHA for over a year will be returning to Australia and 1RHA itself will be heading for some well-earned post-tour leave.

"When we get back, we'll play some sport, do some adventure training, convert back to AS90 and off we go!" concluded Lt Col Bennett.

Now the Unit is back in Tidworth, the team of 15 Australians who have been with 1RHA for over a year will be returning to Australia and 1RHA itself will be heading for some well-earned post-tour leave.

A New Bell for Holy Trinity



A full peel of bells rang out from Holy Trinity Church in Tidworth on 26th March, for the first time in a very long time.

The last time anyone can remember hearing them rung was when they were tested during the 2nd World War when it was planned that they should be used as a warning of enemy invasion !

The new sixth bell was cast at the Whitechapel Bell Foundry in London on 21st August 2009 and is dedicated to

Kennet District Council and Tidworth Town Council which both provided grants towards the cost.

The inscription on the bell (in English, rather than Latin, as on the older bells), reads :

'WITH APPRECIATION. KENNET DISTRICT & TIDWORTH TOWN COUNCIL 21ST AUGUST 2009'

G'bye Mates -

It's been great knowing you !

Australian soldiers from Darwin-based 8/12 Medium Regiment, the Royal Australian Artillery, have completed a six-month tour of Afghanistan manning guns alongside British soldiers from 1st Regiment Royal Horse Artillery (1RHA).

The 15 men formed the 'Brumby' troop - named after the wild Australian horse from the Snowy Mountains - and spent 6 months training in the UK with 1RHA before deploying last October. In Afghanistan, they were responsible for two 105 mm Light Guns working out of Forward Operating Base Armadillo in Helmand Province. They were the fourth Australian Artillery unit to deploy with the British Army.



On 16 April, 1RHA held a special open-air breakfast, remembrance church service and a medal parade at Assaye Barracks, to bid farewell and God-speed to the Aussie soldiers

who had become so much a part of the Regiment during the 14 months they served together.

They were presented with their Operation Herrick medals by General Sir Timothy Granville-Chapman, the Honorary Colonel of 1 RHA and the British Army's Master Gunner.

After 14 months away from home, their return to Darwin was delayed a few more days by the grounding of aeroplanes because of volcanic ash over the UK, but they are looking forward to a well-deserved five weeks break when they eventually arrive back home!

Marathon des Sables



Lt Tom Sayer, 26, from 1 (Mechanized) Brigade has overcome the extreme terrain and heat of the Sahara Desert to complete what is billed as "the toughest foot race on earth."

This was the 25th Marathon de Sables which takes place annually in Morocco. The race covers 156 miles in 7 days in temperatures averaging 45 degrees C (125 F), over sand and mountains, with runners carrying everything they need for the race in rucksacks on their backs.

"It was without doubt the toughest thing I have ever done", said Tom.

Pictured here with running companion Vijay Ahuja, a doctor in the Royal Navy, Tom came 124th out of 1013 runners and was 15th out of the 250 British competitors.

The pair are hoping to have raised up to £40,000 to be shared between two charities, 'Help for Heroes' and 'Facing Africa', a charity which helps African children.

Sappers will cross flood bridge for charity



Thirty two Sappers from 3 Armoured Squadron, 22 Engineer Regiment based in Perham Down are about to embark on a sponsored charity run from John O'Groats to Land's End. They plan to cover the 880 miles in just 11 days to raise money for three Service charities : ABF The Soldiers' Charity, SSAFA and Help for Heroes, and the John Radcliffe Hospital in Oxford.

Their route will be taking them over the footbridge at Workington which they helped to build at the end of last year following the floods which destroyed the old bridge and separated the two parts of the town. The footbridge has been named, "The Barker Crossing", in memory of PC Bill Barker who was swept to his death in the floods.

"We're looking forward to meeting up with all those people in the community and local businesses who so generously supported us last November when we were building the bridge", said SSgt Graham Bedford.
