The Kiwi receives Royal Visitor

Her Royal Highness The Princess Royal, Colonel-in-Chief of The Royal Corps of Signals, visited Bulford on 28th November, to observe the final day of the 3-day Kiwi Trophy march and shoot competition.



All members of 3 Signal Regiment and attached Arms take part in the 14-mile competition which starts and finishes at the top of the Kiwi Monument in Bulford. The challenging route takes the competitors from Bulford, past the hillfort on Tidworth's Sidbury Hill towards Everleigh and back across the Training Area (including a river crossing), to the firing ranges, before finishing with a killing 300-metre uphill run back to the top of the Kiwi.

Her Royal Highness watched the competitors as they finished the challenge at the top of Beacon Hill and presented the prizes afterwards.



The winning Squadron was 228 Signal Squadron and the fastest individual participant was Lance Corporal Dean Smith, 22, a Physical Training Instructor with 3rd Signal Regiment. He finished with a time of two hours twenty-one minutes, carrying a 12.5 kilo bergen and a rifle.

"It's a hard event but you've got to put your head down and put one foot in front of the other, and no matter how much that pains then you've got to keep going", he said. "You just see the guys in front of you and you just keep picking them off."

The Kiwi was carved into the chalk of the hillside in 1919 by New Zealanders awaiting repatriation after the Great War. In 1980, 249 Signal Squadron spent 3 days moving 100 tonnes of fresh chalk to restore it to its former glory.



Earlier in the day an Act of Remembrance took place at Tidworth Military Cemetery, where there are three hundred Anzac graves. Wing Commander Nick Olney NZAF, the Air Attaché in London, attended to represent the soldiers, sailors and airman of the New Zealand Defence Force and the Governor of New Zealand. "It's always important to come and recognise the sacrifices that our Servicemen have made around the world", he said.

Royal Welsh Soldier wins Army Sports Award 2014



Lance Corporal Ashley Williams, 23, who serves with 1 Royal Welsh in Tidworth, has been named The British Army's Sportsman of the Year 2014.

Lance Corporal Williams has been with the Army Boxing Team for four years and, in

early 2014, the Welsh Boxing Association made him Captain of the squad competing at the Commonwealth Games in London.

During the Games he won a Bronze medal for Wales and this achievement is one for which both he and the Army Boxing Association can be justifiably proud. He has now set his sights on the Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro in 2016.

"This is a massive honour to be nominated and then to win the award", he said. "We're soldiers first and foremost and I'm an infantry soldier, so to take this trophy back to my regiment after all they've done to support me by giving me the time to train and compete will I hope make it all worthwhile".

LCpl Williams was presented with his award by top former athlete Colin Jackson.

Change of Command Parade as Aries replaces the Wyvern

An historic Change of Command Parade took place on 9th December 2014 to mark the transition of Headquarters 43 (Wessex) Brigade (HQ 43 (Wx) Bde) to Headquarters 1 Artillery Brigade (HQ 1 Arty Bde) and Headquarters South West (HQ SW), the new Regional Point of Command.

The Change of Command, part of the structural changes made under Army 2020, was formally marked at Jellalabad Barracks by the lowering of the Wyvern Flag and the raising of the Aries.



"It is a sad day for this iconic Brigade, which has its deep roots in the South West and the counties of the South West", said 43 (Wx) Brigade Commander, Brigadier Piers Hankinson, before departing in a Rolls Royce Armoured

Car along a route lined by Headquarters staff and invited guests, who included Commander Land Forces, Lt Gen James Everard, and several Lord Lieutenants including Wiltshire's Mrs Sarah Rose Troughton.

HQ 43 (Wx) Bde can trace its roots to the formation of the Wessex Division in 1908. It was fully mobilised and expanded to Divisional size for both World Wars, being involved in conflicts in Mesopotamia, India and Palestine during the First World War and in Normandy and Germany in the Second.

The recent role for HQ 43 (Wx) Bde has been UK operations, (such as the flooding in early 2014), and it has also had the responsibility to support the mounting of operations, including the provision of administrative support to deployed personnel and their families and Reception Arrangements for Military Patients. It has also been responsible for organising the annual Ten Tors event on Dartmoor.

Established under Army 2020 and under command of Brigadier Jez Bennett, HQ 1 Arty Brigade will command deployable forces and provide Joint Fires Cells for Divisional HQs. HQ SW will assume the Regional Point of Contact responsibilities in the South West which were previously undertaken by 43 (Wx) Bde.



Comd 1 Arty Bde, Brigadier Jez Bennett, explained about the practicalities of such a set up, given the demands of artillery deployments and UK operations.

"We have a big exercise doing Artillery firing in Otterburn in March and the weather will be at its worst in March, so there is a risk we will be split at that time between artillery deployments and UK ops - but we are ready for it. I am very lucky to have two full colonel deputies - one dealing entirely with artillery the other with regional matters and they will focus on these activities - and I will go wherever I am most needed."

Action Man makes history

The greatest height from which most 'Action Men' toys ever make a parachute jump is usually from an upstairs bedroom window, which is not really high enough to see whether the parachute really works correctly. So, last Summer, James May and his "Toy Stories" team arrived at Netheravon Airfield determined to find the answer, as part of a programme they were making for the BBC.

After an impressive 5-way with Netheravon's Team Isis, (team photo above!), Major Anna Hicks deployed the childhood hero's parachute and watched him fly gently back to earth. Despite his canopy handling skills being a bit rusty, his parachute worked perfectly! The complete programme was aired on Christmas Day.

Jackie Harper, Secretary of the Army Parachute Association based in Netheravon, has been confirmed as the overall winner of the Wingsuit Performance World Series 2014, with her husband Spike taking second place. The competition was over 4 events worldwide with 100 international Wingsuiters taking part.

"We are really thrilled", Jackie told Drumbeat. "The competition in the UK in May was the first in the series."

Kiwi School on Navigation Exercise with 1 MERCIAN

Soldiers from 1st Battalion the Mercian Regiment have been imparting their map reading skills to children from Kiwi School in Bulford.

Students from year 4, 5 and 6 from Kiwi School received the short lesson in basic navigation as part of their Maths week, before setting off into the Army training area to find their way around an orienteering course with some of the 1 MERCIAN soldiers.

Just one short lesson from a Mercian navigation instructor enabled each group of students to navigate their way around the training area using a map and compass. Each checkpoint was manned by a number of soldiers ready to assist with the map reading and to demonstrate some of the key military capabilities.

Normally, the soldiers are used to navigating across much more difficult terrain.

"In the desert there just aren't any landmarks to use!" said LCpl Vance Bacon. "It's the same with the Canadian prairies. It's times like that you do need to be able to use a compass!"



Major Rob Prentice, the 1 MERCIAN Second-in-Command, was very pleased to be able to help.

"1 MERCIAN is a family and when the opportunity came up for our soldiers to share their skills with students from our local school, we jumped at it," he said. "A large number of the school children have parents in the Battalion, so it was really nice for them to see what their Mums and Dads get up to at work!"

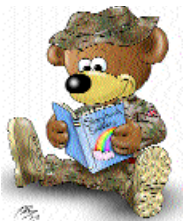

Mercian Eagles look back and to the future ...

Around 750 soldiers from the 1st Battalion the Mercian Regiment, Salisbury Plain's most recently arrived Army unit, commemorated one of their Battle Honours at a Drumhead parade in Bulford on 15 December 2014.



The hard fought battle of Ferozeshah took place in 1845, in what is now Pakistan but then India. So many officers were wounded or killed during the battle that the Colours had to be carried by the Regiment's Sergeants. To commemorate this, every year on the anniversary of the Battle, the Regiment's Colours are formally handed to the Sergeants' Mess for safekeeping for 24 hours - even when, as happened last year, they were at Forward Operating Base Price in Afghanistan.

Following a complicated merger of battalions last Summer as part of the Army 2020 restructuring of the Army, 1 MERCIAN moved to Bulford with soldiers coming from Germany, Catterick and Northern Ireland.

"The Army is changing and so are we, but as long as we continue to remember our past, we will continue to be the same Regiment that has always produced success on operations", said the Commanding Officer of 1 MERCIAN, Lieutenant Colonel Mark Ellwood MBE.

"It's a new beginning for us. We are settling into the area really well. There is nowhere better to be. We have got the training area right at the back of us and fantastic facilities here. It is a privilege for us to be part of the Reactive Force of the Army and at the heart of the Army here in Wiltshire."

Since their arrival in Bulford, 1 MERCIAN has begun training for its new role as an Armoured Infantry unit within 1 Armoured Infantry Brigade, with over 80 soldiers completing the new WARRIOR Tactical Turret Commander's Course on Salisbury Plain Training Area. The course is designed to give tactical experience to personnel who, until now, have only been qualified to drive, gun and manoeuvre Warrior infantry fighting vehicles on the road. With the switch of focus post Afghanistan to Combined Arms Manoeuvre, the course reinvigorates a skills base that can be used by the Army looking to future operations.

Following a week of classroom-based study, the soldiers took the fight out on to the training area and were assessed on their ability not only to command the vehicle over difficult terrain but also direct the firepower and armour to support dismounted infantry on the ground.

The battalion is now continuing to train for their deployment to Canada in late summer, which will be the first major exercise to test 1 MERCIAN after rerolling to the Armoured Infantry Role under A2020.



A well-deserved Honour

Martin Colclough, Head of Sports Recovery at Help for Heroes, was awarded the Order of the British Empire (OBE) in the Queen's Birthday Honours for his involvement with disability sport for over 20 years. He received his award from HM The Queen at Windsor Castle on 5th December.



Martin has been the driving force behind the delivery of a comprehensive Sports Recovery programme at Help for Heroes, which has been in existence for six years and includes grass roots, performance sports and adventure training for Service personnel and veterans who have faced life-changing injuries or illness.

David Richmond, Director of Recovery at Help for Heroes said: "It's wonderful to see Martin recognised for his work. We are hugely proud of the Sports Recovery programme, which has

helped over 1,800 individuals alone in the last year. The programme runs over 300 different activities, across 50 different sports to enable our heroes to get involved in sport at any level. Martin's passion and extraordinary commitment has made the programme the success it is today and it is fabulous to see him honoured by HM The Queen.

"Martin's selfless leadership and infectious passion have ensured the growth of the programme and enabled so many to achieve their sporting dreams, including representing their country at a Paralympic Games."

Off-Roading on Salisbury Plain

The unauthorised use of motor vehicles (both four-wheel and two-wheel) that are in breach of the Military Lands Bye-laws are attracting official concern and action.

Irresponsible 'off-roading' activity is placing legitimate users (both military and members of the public) at risk, is disrupting training and is causing damage to the training area. This activity also places the participants at risk from the many unmarked and unsigned hazards across the Plain for which the MoD owns some liability. Regrettably, irresponsible and unauthorised off-roading is not confined to the civilian community but extends to serving members of the Armed Forces.

Salisbury Plain Military Lands Bye-law signs are displayed at all prominent Public Rights of Way track entrances to the area. Relevant to off-roading activity are the following:

- All vehicles must be road legal, i.e. taxed, insured, have a valid MOT and a number plate, etc.
- Drivers must comply with all MOD signs and notices (e.g. "Keep out when flags are flying") and must comply with the universal speed limit of 30 mph.
- Motor vehicles only have the right to use appropriate rights of way i.e. 'Byways Open to All Traffic', when not closed by barriers or red flags.
- Motor vehicles may also use military roads made up for vehicular use (e.g. stone tracks) but MUST give way to all military activity.
- Motor vehicles must not enter any wooded plantation unless on a right of way authorised for motor vehicles.

NB. mini-motor bikes are not road-legal and therefore cannot be insured. They can therefore ONLY be used on truly 'private property' where no members of the public have access.
