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Bulford Quarters to be Upgraded

Some of the Service Families' Accommodation in Bulford is to be upgraded, in a three-year programme due to start in the Autumn.

Altogether, 220 Quarters will be refurbished, with the work to be done in each house being decided according to its condition, in order to upgrade each house from grade 3 to grade 1.

The programme will begin at the South end of New Ward Road, with 26 houses being refurbished in the 2008-9 financial year, 85 in 2009-10 and 109 in 2010-11.

Occupants will need to move in order for the work to be done, but all will be notified in good time.

Royal backing for New School at Castledown

Prince Andrew is to become President of The Wellington Academy, the new state school at Castledown, sponsored by Wellington College.

As President, HRH The Duke of York will maintain a close interest in the Academy's affairs and visit from time to time. The Duke's appointment mirrors the role of HRH The Duke of Kent, who is President of Wellington College which was founded by Queen Victoria and has maintained close links with the Royal Family.

"Prince Andrew's appointment is extremely good news, both for the school community and for the wider academies programme," said Dr Anthony Seldon, Master of Wellington College. "Support for an academy by the Royal Family is a very significant moment in the history of this innovative model of schooling, which I see as one of the most significant educational ideas to emerge for decades."

Funding for the Academy, of approximately £25m, has recently been agreed by the Department for Children, Schools and Families (DCSF). This will go towards the creation of new school buildings, boarding houses and the Combined Cadet Force (CCF) headquarters at the Castledown site in Ludgershall.

"The new Academy is unique", Castledown's Head Teacher, John Pender, told Drumbeat. "It will be the first Rural Academy. It is also the first Academy to be created from a highly successful school, and it is anticipated that the additional funding will ensure Castledown's continuing success. Negotiations are taking place between Governors and Wellington College to ensure a smooth transition in 2009."

The Wellington Academy is to be a new, mixed, non-denominational secondary school which will admit up to 1,150 students including the sixth form. The students will be drawn from all backgrounds, abilities and faiths and will specialise in foreign languages and business and enterprise. Up to 100 boarding places will also be available, many of which are expected to be taken by the children of Forces families.

As sponsor, Wellington College will provide support to the new school in academic and administrative matters as well as in leadership and governance. The College wants the Academy to capture the educational vision and ethos of Wellington College in the richness and diversity of the opportunities it will offer all its pupils. Several key aspects of the new school are to be modelled on its sponsor, including a commitment to excellence, a house system, the eight aptitudes educational approach, well-being lessons and an emphasis on outdoor activities and service. It is proposed that sixth-form provision could include the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme. Academy students will be offered the opportunity to engage with Wellington College activities and networks with particular emphasis on its international links.

Wellington College is one of the UK's top co-educational independent schools, originally founded to educate the children of Army officers who died whilst serving their country. It now has a broad intake from the UK and overseas and only a minority of pupils are the sons and daughters of military personnel.

The appointment of the Academy's first Principal has also been announced. Andy Schofield is to be Principal Designate. He is currently Head Teacher at Varndean School in Brighton and Hove, having previously been deputy head at that school. He is the chairman of the Specialist Schools & Academies Trust Futures Vision group, which published the widely acclaimed 'Essential Questions for the Future School' in 2006. He is a regular speaker at conferences in this country and abroad, and has also been a frequent contributor to the Times Educational Supplement.

The Academy is replacing Castledown Foundation School which will change its status to an Academy from September 2009. The new school will operate for a year from existing school buildings, moving to a new building on the same site in 2010. Pupil numbers will grow from its existing 500 pupils to over 1,000.

This development builds on the hard work of Castledown staff who have achieved significant academic improvement in recent years. Existing Castledown staff are entitled to transfer to the new Academy and places will automatically be available for all current pupils.

HQ Land Forces on the move ...

Headquarters Land Command in Wilton and Headquarters Adjutant General in Upavon merged on 1 April 2008 to form Headquarters Land Forces (HQLF). Under Project Hyperion, HQLF plans to co-locate its headquarters to Andover, with the main move in mid-2010 and the remainder moving when the current occupants leave.

The original plan had been to build new office accommodation on Andover South Site to create a single building to house the whole headquarters. On 7 March 08, the Chief of Defence Materiel announced that Defence Equipment and Support (DE&S) intend to vacate the Andover site completely by 2012. This gives HQLF access to an additional office accommodation block meaning that a new build is no longer required. The new plan is subject to confirmation and formal TU consultation.

The intention remains that the Wilton site will be offered up for disposal and, although it cannot be discounted, the likelihood is that no alternative Defence use will be found for it. The Army will be looking to empty the site as early as possible after mid-2010 so that disposal procedures can start without delay.

It is intended that the Upavon site will be 'mothballed' until funding can be found to develop it for another Army use. This could take some while, but its location is such that it is a valuable asset for the Army and it will not therefore be offered for disposal.

Iron Men prepare for Ironman

A team from 3 MERCIAN will be taking part in this year's Ironman Triathlon on the Island of Lanzarote, often regarded as the hardest Ironman, due to the heat, the terrain and the unpredictable winds. It consists of swimming over 2.4 miles in the sea, followed immediately by cycling 112 miles around the island through the mountains and lava fields and then running a full marathon.

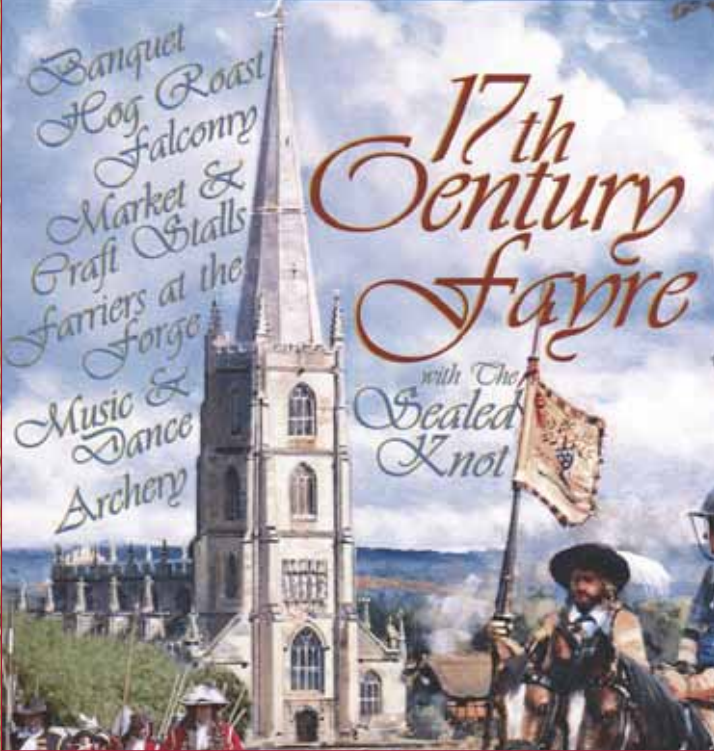
