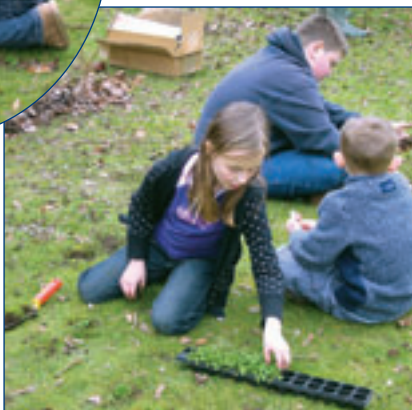

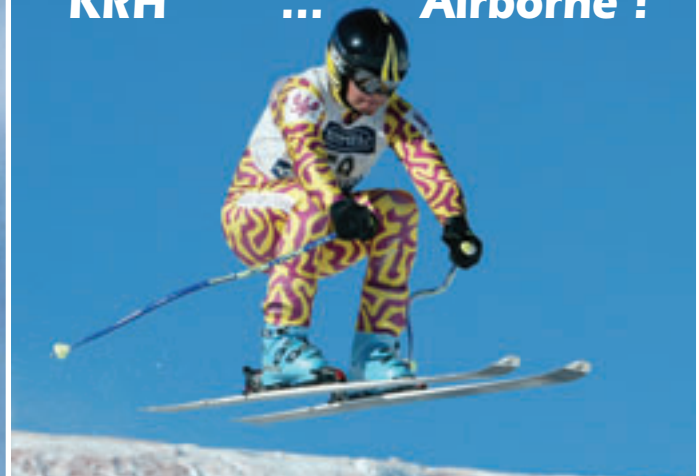

## 1RHA Memorial Stone unveiled

Lt Col Simon Humphrey unveiled the new 1RHA Memorial area in Assaye Barracks last month.

He is pictured here with Robbie Campbell, the Managing Director of MUJV Ltd, a business partner to Aspire Defence, which funded the memorial in conjunction with M Holleran Ltd and Veolia Water (formerly Thames Water).



The building of the memorial area coincided with 1RHA's deployment to Iraq and the demolition and rebuild of the barracks. It was built using bricks from the original 1902 barracks and the granite stone itself was brought back from Op Granby, the first Gulf War, in 1991. "Thanks to MUJV, we now have a fitting and highly impressive memorial", said Lt Col Humphrey. "It will be a point of focus for my Regiment and a huge help in supporting Unit identity and soldiers' morale."

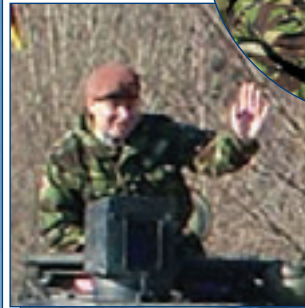
## New Commanding Officer for the Kings Royal Hussars

## ... and news from B Sqn in Afghanistan

B Sqn have deployed on Op HERRICK 7 as part of 52 Light Bde. During the summer of 2007 they converted from CR2 to Mastiff in order to take up the role of a mounted close combat and protective mobility Sqn. B Sqn are an enormous manoeuvre asset to the Bde and as such operate independently across the British AO. Notably the Sqn was deeply involved in the battle of Musa Qaleh which is a small town in the Northern extremes of Helmand Province. The Sqn was instrumental as the investment force, ensuring that the coalition had a firm foothold on the town prior to launching a multi-national attack. Musa Qaleh was of extremely high strategic importance and harboured the nub of opium production in the province. The Sqn is now acting as a more disparate force, spreading it's capability across the depth of the Bde's battle-space. Half of the Sqn remains in the North working with 40 Commando Royal Marines, Sqn HQ and 2nd Tp in the South with the Household Cavalry BG and 3rd Tp reinforcing the Regimental bond with 1 RGR in Garmsir. The Sqn last reported having been deployed in the 'field' for the past 72 days and are starting to look forward to their return to the UK in March.



## News from Shipton Bellinger

In October last year residents in the village of Shipton Bellinger woke up to find that graffiti had been sprayed on cars, fences, front doors and play park equipment in the village.

PC Bill Williams from Hampshire Constabulary's Rural Test Valley Safer Neighbourhood Team is the Beat Manager for that area and worked closely with local residents to identify who was responsible.

Three girls aged 14, 15 and 17 were jointly charged with 12 counts of criminal damage amounting to over £1500. On 6th February each girl pleaded guilty at Basingstoke Youth Court and was given a maximum 12 month referral order which will involve regular meetings with the youth offending team and work to clean up the graffiti in the village.

At the time these incidents were reported it was suggested that the offenders had specifically targeted military families and their property. **The Hampshire**

**Constabulary worked closely with the Royal Military Police throughout the investigation and can confirm that this was not the case.** These were random acts of mindless criminal damage that were spread across the village and not aimed at particular individuals.



## Householders have a duty of care when disposing of rubbish !

Householders may be prosecuted if they fail to take reasonable measures to ensure that the household waste produced on their property is disposed of correctly. If materials get fly-tipped, you can now be held responsible and are liable to get fined.

Enforcement of the regulations has resulted in several successful prosecutions following household waste having been found dumped on Salisbury Plain Training Area and within Garrison housing estates.

The maximum penalties for persons committing offences under the regulations are :

Crown Court : Unlimited fine and/or 5 years imprisonment

Magistrates Court : £50,000 fine and/or 12 months imprisonment

Residents are advised to ask potential waste contractors if they are a registered waste carrier and check their credentials, making a note of their waste carrier number. Checks can be made by contacting the Environment Agency on 08708 - 506506 and asking for a Waste Carrier Validation Check. 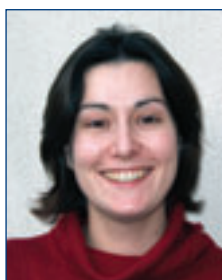

## New Commanding Officer for 4 Bn The Rifles

The new Commanding Officer of 4th Battalion The Rifles, Lt Col Rupert Jones, is determined that 2008 will be a year of consolidation, and hopefully fun, for the 600 men under his command, after the tour in Iraq last year during which they lost five colleagues.



"The tempo of events in the British Army sometimes makes that a little bit difficult," he said, "But we are now in a training year and I want to allow people to do some fun things - play sport, do some adventure training, see their families and generally enjoy garrison life. They need time to get some balance back in their lives and do all the things that make a battalion tick.

"I really want to focus on consolidation. It was a brutal tour last year and they all did some extraordinary things ... We lost some significant individuals - men who were leaders of a very high calibre and that is always difficult. But I do have a sense that the battalion is now looking forward - and the Riflemen are very resilient."

Rupert Jones knows what it is like to lose a person of huge significance: He was 13 when his father, Lt Col 'H' Jones, died in the Falklands War leading his men into battle at Goose Green in 1982. He was posthumously awarded the Victoria Cross for outstanding gallantry. He is reluctant to be compared to his well-known father, but knows that the public interest will constantly be there.

"I have always said that if I wanted to avoid the connection I should have become a bank manager. I prefer to keep Rupert Jones the Army officer and Rupert Jones the son separate, but I accept there will always be some overlay.

"It is a great honour to take command of 4 RIFLES," Lt Col Jones concluded. "It has a fantastic reputation and morale is very high, but I don't sense it is resting on its laurels. It is getting back to doing its normal job of an Infantry battalion."

## Old Adversaries Reconciled ...



Guest of Honour at this year's St David's Day Parade at Lucknow Barracks was the Zulu leader, Chief Buthelezi. The Zulu Chief's ancestors were among the 4,500 Zulus who fought against a small British force of 139 men defending the mission at Rorke's Drift in 1879. These men were from B Company, 2nd Bn, 24th Foot (South Wales Borderers), one of the antecedent Regiments of 2 R Welsh.

In our picture, Chief Buthelezi is being introduced to the men of B (Rorke's Drift) Company, 2 R Welsh, by the Officer Commanding B Company, Major Steve Webb.

"In my culture, when people have fought, they have mutual respect for each other", said the Chief, adding, "You are the best of the Welsh and the best of the British!"

The following day, Chief Buthelezi visited the Museum of the Royal Welsh in Brecon, pausing several times to inspect Zulu assegais, knobkerries and beadwork worn by the Zulu warriors and brought back as trophies by survivors of the battle.

"This has been a journey of souls for me", he said. "My Grandfather participated in this historic event and survived. The experience has been very moving. It is important to pay tribute to the people on both sides of this conflict. Whatever problems we may have had in the past, we are now bound by these events. It is important that we keep this bond of mutual respect for ever."
