KRH Medals Parade

In a message to the families at the parade, Lt Col Orr wrote, "The Kings Royal Hussars is extremely proud to be a family Regiment and I recognise the importance of your role in the lives of my soldiers. The successes that we achieve while on operations are made possible by your continued support and encouragement; therefore, your presence today is as important as the soldiers on Parade."

On tour in Iraq, the Regiment performed many different tasks, from counter-smuggling operations on the border with Iran, living in the desert like nomads, to escort duties for convoys and raids in the centre of Basra City which involved leaving Challengers behind and learning how to crew Warriors and WIMIKs!

After the Medal parade, the Regiment marched to St Michael's Church for a Service of Thanksgiving.

Movie Machine on the move !



British troops in Afghanistan will soon be getting a big welfare boost : SSVC's giant Movie Machine, a state-of-the-art, 80-seat cinema on wheels, is deploying to Camp Bastion in Helmand Province.



Housed in the largest vehicle which is road-legal, this amazing rig can transform from articulated lorry to push cinema in just half an hour, with one man driving and operating it. With its air-conditioning and full-size cinema seats, the Movie Machine will provide a welcome respite for Service personnel, offering 3 screenings a day of the latest films, soon after their UK release.

After spending 5 years in Bosnia and Kosovo, the £500K Movie Machine is now being flown into Afghanistan on the world's largest heavy-lifter aircraft, the Antonov 124.

Commanders in Theatre will find it a useful asset, as the Movie Machine can be used for showing military training films, briefings - and has even been used by Padres for church Services !

The Movie Machine was purchased by the SSVC Operational Welfare Fund and is maintained by the MOD.

2 RTR celebrates Cambrai Day

20 November 1917 saw the British launch a surprise massed tank attack at Cambrai on the Western Front. Within



hours, the Germans were forced back some 6 km to Cambrai, with the three-trench systems of the Hindenburg

Line pierced for the first time in the war. This was the first time that tanks had been used successfully in battle, demonstrating their potential in offensive operations.

The Royal Tank Regiment celebrates 'Cambrai Day' on 20th November every year. 2RTR held a Drumhead Service outside their new Regimental Headquarters in Tidworth, after Iraq Medals for Op TELIC 9 had been presented to Egypt Squadron by Director Royal Armoured Corps, Brigadier S. Caraffi. During a football match held later that afternoon, a team was chosen to play against 1RTR at Cambrai, where the two Regiments gathered at the end of the month, to mark the 90th Anniversary of the battle.

100 down ... 340 to go !

Another milestone was passed by Project Allenby/Connaught last month as the 100th building, an old power station in Tidworth, was demolished.



"Demolition within the construction industry does not get a lot of acknowledgement - it deserves more than it gets", said Keith Hutton, Aspire Defence's Tidworth Project Director. "If we don't demolish things on time, the programme is delayed. What we have here is well planned, well managed and well executed demolition ... 100 buildings down, 340 to go !"

"This Project is beginning to make a significant difference to the way soldiers lead their lives", said Deputy Garrison Commander Colonel Richard Aubrey Fletcher. "Soldiers coming back from demanding operational tours are now beginning to live in better accommodation. I have been hugely impressed by the organisation of the project, the demolition process and not least by the recycling effort. Clearly we all know how fragile our planet is and clearly the recycling effort that has been made here is a shining example of how it should and can be done !"

The old power station dates back to 1913 and it will take sub-contractors Hughes and Salvidge around two weeks to demolish it, salvaging many of the bricks and tiles which will be re-used elsewhere on site.

The original steam beam engines at the power station provided electricity for the garrison and the local area, using coal which was brought into the garrison by train on a railway line which ran directly to the power station. It remained in use until 1937 when the garrison was connected to the national grid.

Catterick to get FM Radio ...

After a long wait, Catterick Garrison has finally been awarded an FM Community Radio Licence by broadcast authority OfCom. The "Garrison FM" service will launch in the New Year, taking over from the current MW service.

with as many details as possible. for example :

- Date
- Time
- Location

(if not a grid reference, then as much information as possible, eg East, Centre or West, plantation name, tank crossing number, farm or training feature name.)

- What or who were seen, vehicle registration number
- What were they doing that caused concern
- Your own contact details : tel no, address etc.

Do not enter into a confrontation but merely report what you have seen from afar. Your evidence may be needed by the Police.
