Army Radio switches to 106.8 FM

Officially launched by Johnny Vaughan, star of Channel 4 and Capital Radio, the Garrison's long-awaited FM radio service went live on 11th December.

"It's like the switch from black and white to colour telly! This signal is going to be fantastic. It's going to get to everyone", Johnny said as he prepared to cut the ribbon. "With so many of the lads and the ladies serving overseas now, radio really does create more of a community and it will help keep morale up, which is a crucial thing. So often technology goes into machines of war and fighting, but this is one that actually helps the people back home who often have to suffer while their loved ones are away, so it really is a fantastic thing".

With the radio mast located in Bulford, Salisbury Plain Army Radio covers a large part of the Plain, from Upavon to Wilton and from Westdown to Andover, providing better quality reception for soldiers, their families and the local communities in which they live.

The launch was attended by Larkhill Garrison Commander, Colonel Ian Tinsley, and Tidworth, Netheravon & Bulford Deputy Garrison Commander, Colonel Richard Aubrey-Fletcher, who said :

"Radio is a fantastic medium. In Tidworth and Bulford we are fortunate to have had our own radio station, Garrison Radio, for nearly 6 years now. It broadcasts 24 hours a day and costs the listener nothing. The move to FM is an exciting development which means that Larkhill will also be able to receive it and everyone will benefit from the improved broadcast quality.

"The radio station has an excellent record of helping to maintain the link with the troops when they are away from the Garrison. With operational deployments for both 1 and 12 Mechanised Brigades next year, this enhanced capability to deliver welfare support and maintain community links will prove invaluable."

The Royal Centre for Defence Medicine's Alexandra Wing at Selly Oak Hospital in Birmingham has recently been extensively refurbished, thanks in part to funds donated by The Services Sound and Vision Corporation (SSVC).

The Alexandra Wing provides recreational and administrative support and accommodation for military outpatients and families visiting relatives admitted to Selly Oak, the hospital that all casualties from operational tours go to on arrival in the UK.

'This facility is an important part of the medical support given to Service personnel and their families', said Air Commodore Tony Batchelor, Commandant of the Royal Centre for Defence Medicine. "Through generous contributions from SSVC and AIG we have been able to give the unit a new lease of life. Alexandra Wing is now a more welcoming, comfortable and supportive environment.'



SSVC is the third largest forces charity in terms of turnover. Their activities are carried out directly

for the Ministry of Defence at cost, with any profits donated to the Forces Central Welfare Funds or distributed through their own Operational Welfare Fund. Bulford MOD Policeman receives National recognition

One of the most familiar faces in Bulford has received recognition from Home Secretary John Reid, as one of the nation's top community police officers.



Viv Phillips, who has been in the MOD Police for more than 22 years, 10 of them in Bulford, chatted at length with Dr Reid at an awards ceremony in the City of London, hosted by BBC Crimewatch presenter Nick Ross.

He described his role as a Beat Officer in an Army Garrison :

"We look after our married quarter areas and step up our patrols, as do the Military Police, when troops deploy and wives and families are left behind," he said. "I deal with Unit Welfare Officers and I go into schools in the garrison to take part in citizenship and drug awareness programmes.

"The main part of the job is communication. Once a month we have a meeting with both Hampshire and Wiltshire Police and the Military Police. We rigorously enforce the speed limits here - especially on military roads that are open to the public. We have schools here and young children so motorists have to learn to control their speed and be aware of our rules."

As for the future, Viv is happy to stay where he is. "I like the job I do and I like coming to work," he said with a smile.

KRH Soldier rewarded for Courage



Cpl Stephen Farling has been recognised for his courage and steadiness under fire during a six month tour in Afghanistan earlier this year.

Stephen, 32, was Mentioned in Despatches in the Operational Honours List announced on 14th December. Normally a Challenger 2 tank commander, he was posted to northern Helmand province as part of the UK Operational Mentoring and Liaison team to train members of the Afghan National Army.

On 11 June he was operating as a rear gunner on a stripped-down Land Rover when it was ambushed by a large enemy force using Rocket Propelled Grenades, small arms and heavy machine guns.

The citation recording his actions states:

"Cpl Farling remained at his post in a most exposed and precarious position throughout the seven-hour contact. Between enemy engagements he remained alert and was invariably the first to detect enemy activity. He was at all times calm and focussed, encouraging the younger crew members, whilst concurrently relaying messages from the patrol commander to the radio operator.

"Throughout the incident he displayed great personal courage, steadiness under fire and aggressive leadership. With complete disregard for his own safety he remained at his post, which was the focus for enemy fire, suppressing the enemy and preventing them from overwhelming the patrol. As a direct result of his actions the enemy was thwarted and the lives of his fellow patrol members were saved."

Project Allenby : Estates Maintenance

The 10th July 2006 saw a change in the way that maintenance and asset management is delivered to the TidNBul Garrison.

As with all Aspire Defence services, a reactive response to system faults and damage to the estate [in terms of building assets, grounds or infrastructure including roads and pathways], can be reported to the Aspire Defence Helpdesk.

Following a call to the Helpdesk in Kannada House, a work docket is produced which is sent electronically to the Resource Allocators, whose job it is to ensure that the right engineer is assigned to attend each request for reactive maintenance. They are also responsible for the scheduling of all planned works.

Aspire engineers are issued with the latest PDA mobile technology which enables the Emergency and Urgent jobs to be sent directly to each individual engineer, resulting in a more focussed and effective response time. The Aspire Defence Service team serving the TidNBul garrison employs more than 50 mobile engineers covering all general trades such as electricians, plumbers, gas engineers and carpenters etc. This has been dramatically increased from the levels provided under the old

Defence Estates regime. Each engineer is provided with a van and a basic stock profile to enable them to affect both temporary and permanent repairs, minimising second and third visits where possible. Whenever you see an Aspire van out on the road, the engineer is probably on his van to attend a breakdown or carry out a repair in order to keep the estate running.



Planned and Routine tasks are also generated via the Helpdesk following calls from our customers. In addition to this, tasks are generated by our scheduling software and from requests from the Garrison Management Team. These requests include minor alterations and additions to buildings, both internal and external. All works that are not covered by our emergency and urgent response teams are initially reviewed by our highly qualified technical support staff that assess the material and labour requirements for each job prior to the job being undertaken. This allows repair and replacement works to be carried out in the most efficient manner.

The start of this 35 year contract has been well received by all our staff, particularly those who transferred to us, and we are sure that the customer has started to benefit from changes in the way that we deliver the estates management service.

The chance of a lifetime !



Cpl Steve Hunt (2 R Welsh LAD REME) and Cpl Kev Murray (32 Regt RA Wksp REME) have just returned from New Zealand where they represented the Army at the 81st International 6 Day Enduro event at Taupo, NZ. Over 600 riders from 31 different nations took part in this prestigious off-road motorcycle event - the world's most extreme form of motorcycle endurance racing that pushes man and machine to the limit.

Each day, competitors follow a pre-determined course of around 250 kms, over a variety of different terrains with strict time penalties. There are also Special Tests where competitors ride as fast as they can against the clock over a 4km course. At the end of each day, the riders get 15 minutes in which to carry out all critical maintenance to their bikes and it is not unusual to see a rider change both front and rear tyres, brake pads and oil, all within their allocated 15 minutes !

Despite serious mechanical problems, the British Army team finished 61st out of 133 teams ... and are already training for next year !

News from the Neighbourhood Policing Partnership

Following the successful launch of the Neighbourhood Partnership Team in Tidworth last Summer, two new Teams will be launched this month in the Tidworth Community Area.

PC Mark Eburne will head the new team in Ludgershall which will have its base at the Fire Station and PC Mark Randall will head the Rural team which will cover the Collingbournes and the smaller villages in the Community Area. Both teams will consist of Police Constables, Police Community Support Officers and Special Constables, as in Tidworth.

The Tidworth Team has already carried out several surveys among residents of the town, to establish any particular policing concerns or worries there might be. The survey results and action taken to remedy any problems have been published in Drumbeat.

Recycling after Christmas ...

Christmas cards

The national scheme for recycling Christmas cards is available again this year from 2 - 31 Jan 07 at branches of WH Smith and Tesco. In Tidworth, there are local collection points at the Post Office in Pennings Road and at Tidworth Leisure Centre, as well as Clarendon Infants and Zouch Primary School, until Tuesday 23 Jan 07. Christmas cards can **not** be put into the recycling boxes or paper banks so please make use of this local service !

Christmas trees

These can be recycled at the Household Recycling Centres in Everleigh, Andover or Amesbury, or put into your KDC green wheelie bin with other garden waste.



Glass bottles, aluminium & steel drinks cans, paper ... (but NOT cardboard)

These can all be put into your black recycling box. Additional recyclables that can not fit into your black box can be placed out in carrier bags or taken to your local recycling bring site in Station Road or the British Legion.

Refuse & Recycling Collections

All waste must be put out by 07:00 on the day of collection in an approved receptacle. The lid must be firmly closed with no side waste present. Wheeled bins placed out incorrectly will not be collected.

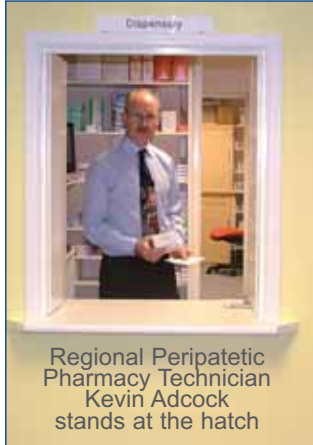

And Rain stopped Play ...



A major exercise on the Salisbury Plain Training Area was called to a halt after just a few days, to prevent damage to the Plain.

For The Kings Royal Hussars, Exercise Druids Dance was to have provided general training in core tank skills followed by a TESEX, (Tactical Engagement Simulation Exercise), in advance of preparations for operational deployment in the Spring; but days of torrential rain had made the ground waterlogged and too soft for the heavy Challenger 2 Battletanks to continue the exercise without causing serious damage.

Lt Col Roger Fellowes, the Commandant of the Salisbury Plain Training Area, based at Westdown Camp in the centre of the Plain, is also a Kings Royal Hussar and sees both sides of the situation :

"We have to balance the training needs of the Army with a responsibility to look after the Plain, which we take very seriously", he said. " We monitor everything very carefully. We have had 120mm rain this month - with 20mm falling last night alone. With a build up of water like that, the chalk just can't absorb it. We usually try to programme these (heavy tank) exercises in drier weather".

Salisbury Plain is the largest unbroken expanse of chalk grassland in NW Europe and one of the best nature reserves in the country, thanks to conservation work by the MOD whose dedicated team of experts at Westdown Camp takes care of the flora, fauna and the unique archaeology on the Plain.

But, as they began to remove the mud from their vehicles and prepared to return to Tidworth, there was frustration among the soldiers, whose vital training for an operational deployment had been interrupted.



"We managed to get some training in the field and, although we did not achieve all objectives, we can still provide a potent and credible tank force ready for any eventuality", said Commanding Officer Lt Col Nick Orr.

"We have to react to uncertainty by being flexible", he continued.

"This time last year, the word was that we would be going to Cyprus. Half way through this year it was changed to Bosnia/Kosovo and now it is to be Iraq. Last time we went it was in the snow! We shall be re-engaging in what is the Army's priority operation".
