## In my View ... Colonel Richard Aubrey-Fletcher

It is now 6 weeks since I took over from Colonel Carron Snagge as the Deputy Garrison Commander. During that time I have been particularly struck by the tempo of activity across the Garrison. Whether it be units preparing for operational deployment, welfare staff supporting our families, managing the changes brought about by Project

Allenby or the provision of education and healthcare, the pace of life is fast and furious – but the results are of impressive quality. I have been impressed by the professionalism and enthusiasm of all those that I have met. Heartening stuff indeed.

But there is no room for complacency. Garrison Headquarters is here to support you all – and there are undoubtedly areas on which we need to focus. We are working hard with our colleagues in Aspire Defence to minimize the impact of the building programme on core business and prepare for Vesting Day on 10 July. In addition, we need to prepare for the deployment of both Brigades on operations.

My first few weeks have been busy, rewarding and above all fun. I look forward to meeting many more of you in the days ahead.

## Changes to Out-of Hours Medical Cover at Garrison Health Centres

Starting on 1st June 2006, a new out-of-hours service will come into operation at Tidworth and Bulford Medical Centres. The changes bring the standard of service provided into line with that offered by the NHS, giving patients access to modern treatment facilities and trained primary care nurses and doctors throughout the night.

From 1st June, there will no longer be an Out-of-Hours Medical Officer or Nurse on call at the Queen Elizabeth Memorial Health Centre (QEMHC) in Tidworth after 16:30.

### The new service will be as follows :

**16:30 - 18:30 Monday - Friday**

Emergency Appointment Service accessed by telephone only. Call 01980 - 602285 (Tid. Mil. 94342 - 2285)

**18:30 - 08:00 Mon - Fri, weekends & public holidays**

A letter is being sent to all Service families and soldiers in the area covered by Garrison Medical Centres, giving full details of the new procedure to follow. Out-of-Hours cover will be given by the local Out-of-Hours service in your area :

Patients will be offered telephone advice or, if appropriate, will be invited to attend their nearest local treatment centre, (which in some cases may be closer than the QEMHC). Military patients should report to the Medical Centre they are registered with on the next working day after receiving treatment; civilian patients should do so only if advised to. There is no change to the service offered during working hours.

The new service will be constantly monitored by the Army Primary Healthcare Service and reviewed on a regular basis to ensure service standards are met and maintained.

## DE 500 New Houses planned for Tidworth

The North East Quadrant in Tidworth comprises some 40 acres situated just off the A338 leading from Tidworth to the Collingbournes. Currently owned by the Ministry of Defence, it is allocated for residential development in the Kennet District Local Plan for both military and private sector housing development. Up to 500 houses may be built on the site and residents and other members of the local community are being encouraged to participate in the proposed new development.

There are 2 public exhibitions planned, which will take place in the Community Centre at Wylve Road. Following this, there will be another opportunity for interested parties to highlight their observations about the scheme at a Discussion Forum also to be held at the Community Centre. This will be limited to 40 people, chosen on a first come first served basis at the above Exhibitions.

Those with an interest in this project for 500 houses are warmly invited to attend the exhibitions where MOD employees will be very glad to answer questions and take feedback from all members of the community.

## Vietnamese Venture

Four officers from 10 AEC

## National Recognition for 10 AEC

The work of the Educational Development Wing at 10AEC, providing literacy, numeracy, ESOL and IT support to our Garrison community, has been recognised by the National Institute of Adult Continuing Education (NIACE) at a ceremony in London during Adult Learners' Week last month.



Flexibility is the key to the programme offered at 10 AEC, ranging from traditional, formal courses to writing letters and emails to learners deployed on operations overseas. Qualifications were gained by nearly 90 % of the 875 learners in 2005, including Pte Anthony Lane (1Staffords) who was named Regional Learner of the Year by NIACE.

## On Top of the World ...

Capt Jonny Taffs AGC (ETS) of 10 Army Education Centre, stands below the North Face of Everest. The snow plume stretching out from the summit indicates winds of over 100 mph! Jonny was a member of the Development Team which successfully summited Lhakpa Ri, standing opposite Everest at 7045m.

"This was the hardest thing I have ever done", Jonny told Drumbeat. "The final 100 metres took over an hour to climb due to the altitude!"

The Development Team was part of the Army Everest West Ridge expedition, which unfortunately had to abandon its attempt to be the first Britons to summit Everest by its demanding West Ridge route because of the risk of avalanches.
