Project Allenby :

Garrison Commander Col Carron Snagge prepares us for the shape of things to come

" Project Allenby/ Connaught has been on the horizon for many months. However all the signs now are that we are in the final stages of contract closure. There is a great deal of pressure at the highest levels to sign the contract before the end of March and "go live" at the end of June. It is interesting that all the deadlines since the New Year have been met and there is a high level of confidence that we are now firmly on track.



" One specific driver is the need to build facilities for 2RTR, who are due back in UK by 21 July 2007, and the deadline to achieve this is now very tight indeed. In Garrison Headquarters we are now ready for this work to start and there is every likelihood that the go ahead will be given before the end of February. This will mean that this work will start before contract signature, probably in early March.

" As far as the inhabitants of the Garrison are concerned this will be the start of a long period of building operations inside our perimeter. It will start with 4 sites in Assaye, Bhurtpore and Candahar Barracks and at its height will involve up to 17 sites in Tidworth alone. Over the next few months the work will spread to Perham Down and Bulford and the whole exercise will last about 8 years. During this period we will all be subjected to a degree of noise, dust, congestion and disruption, and I dare say some confusion. **But in the end we will end up with the most modern barracks in the British Army.**

" In the meantime we in Garrison Headquarters will be setting up a briefing system using every system at our disposal to keep all members of the Garrison informed on what is going on. The systems that we will use will include the chain of command, routine orders, Drumbeat and Garrison Radio and hopefully a walk-in information centre in 10 AEC. Meanwhile, the Garrison Management Team will be doing all that it can to minimise disruption. The priority of course will be the preservation of operational capability in its broadest sense. However, it will not be possible to dispel the disruption completely and all members of the Garrison will have their flexibility challenged and their humour tested. Please also make sure you keep yourself up to date on what is going on and if you have any major concerns feed them back to Garrison Headquarters, using any of the systems that I have suggested. In addition to our own systems Aspire Defence Ltd, the contractors, will be operating their own 'hotline'; this can be used for feedback and will be visible to the Garrison Management Team."

World Airspeed Record

On 10th March 1956, a new world airspeed record was set by the aircraft Fairey Aviation FD2, piloted by Peter Twiss, setting a new time of 1132mph at 38,000ft over a measured course between Chichester and the Royal Naval Air Station at Ford in Sussex.

In fact, it not only broke the existing record by some 310 mph, which had been set by an American F100 aircraft but it was the first record set over 1000mph.

The 50th anniversary will be marked by a celebration luncheon at the Museum of Army Flying at which Peter Twiss OBE DSC will be the Guest of Honour.



Project Allenby :

Pre-Contract Works to begin in Tidworth ...

The Pre-Works programme for the rebuild of Tidworth under Project Allenby is now likely to begin imminently. This work is in advance of the main contract being signed.

The pre-works programme will concentrate on establishing construction site offices, stone crushing and waste disposal sites, demolition of buildings and ground preparation, to enable the construction of the barracks required for 2RTR which must be ready by July 2007.

Once the go-ahead is given, the pre-works involved will be as follows :

(Dates in brackets are the hoped-for start dates)

(1 March 2006) Certain ground sites and buildings in Assaye Barracks, Bhurtpore Barracks and Jellalabad Barracks will be handed over from the Garrison to Aspire Defence. These areas will be fenced off and will be strictly out of bounds to all.

Construction traffic will use designated routes while in camp and enter and leave via Gate 17 at the back of Camp, using the Range Road (10 March 2006). All drivers in camp, please be aware of the increase of traffic. The other advantage of using the Range Road is that congestion in the town of Tidworth will be minimised.

(13 March 2006) Stone crushers will be operating at certain sites during working hours during the week and on Saturdays. There will be some noise and dust from these sites but this will be carefully monitored to minimise disruption to those living and working in close proximity to the sites.

Certain areas inside the wire will be allocated for the temporary parking of contractor vehicles; alternative car parks will be made available for military personnel.

Garrison HQ will keep everyone informed of further developments.

42 troopers returned to Tidworth after post tour leave to be launched into a hectic programme designed to teach, test and assess the qualities of a Junior Non-Commissioned Officer.

The first three days of the Cadre were spent at Aliwal Barracks, where the soldiers undertook a Royal Armoured Corps Command, Leadership and Management (CLM) package designed to give them the knowledge necessary to fulfil their future duties as Lance Corporals. There were also a number of Physical Training assessments, including a demanding log run.

After this, the fun began in earnest, with the potentials deploying to Sennybridge Training Area to enjoy the weather that Wales offers so readily at this time of year !

The Cadre was designed to use infantry tactics as a means to develop and test junior leadership. The rigours and stresses of the cold weather, long period of physical activity, challenging tasks and command appointments revealed a great deal about the characters of those attending the course and developed all in terms of character and the ability to work as a team.

The soldiers enjoyed FIBUA training, platoon attacks, a tough assault course, navigation competitions, a march and shoot competition and a survival phase in which they lived in the field and prepared and ate pheasant.

The Cadre finished with a Pass-Off Parade, with 29 Troopers passing the course. The salute was taken by Major General Shirreff, GOC 3 Div (late KRH). Whilst the eighteen days were certainly tough, those who attended will look back on the experience with pride and a sense of achievement.

Scouting on Salisbury Plain

Scouting is thriving on Salisbury Plain. All the Groups, (7 Scout Groups and 2 Explorer Scout Groups) have enthusiastic teams of leaders and adult supporters, providing interesting programmes and activities for the 300 or so young people.

The problem is that support to the Groups from District level has all but disappeared : Our current District Treasurer, Chairman and Secretary are all standing down after a considerable time in post and other members of the Executive Committee have also decided not to continue. Without a functioning Executive Committee, important functions such as approval of adult leader applications and financial control will cease, which in time will make life difficult for the Groups.

We are therefore urgently seeking suitable volunteers to take on these important roles. The duties are not demanding : The District Executive Committee meets about 5 times a year. The Treasurer maintains the District's accounts and presents them at the AGM, checks the accounts of the Scout Groups and offers advice where required. No formal accounting qualifications are required but would obviously be an advantage. The Secretary deals with correspondence, the AGM, meeting minutes etc and currently processes adult leader applications. The Chairman will chair the Executive Committee meetings and generally promote scouting. No previous knowledge of Scouting is needed; just a willingness to give a little time to keep high quality Scouting available to the young people of Salisbury Plain.
