New Tennis Courts at the Tidworth Leisure Centre Now Open !



Two new floodlit tennis courts in the grounds of the Tidworth Leisure Centre have been officially opened by Major General Simon Lytle CBE, the Director of the Army Sport Control Board. He is pictured here, (centre), with TLC General Manager Stuart McLean and Garrison Commander Col Carron Snagge.

Funding to build the Tennis Courts, amounting to £35,000, was donated by the Army Sport Control Board, the Garrison Commander's Fund and Kennet District Council.

The courts will be available for use by all members of the community, civilian and military, on a first-come first-served basis, seven days a week.

The cost to use the courts is £3.70 per match, which includes use of the TLC's extensive changing rooms, shower facilities and cafeteria; Service personnel will be able to use the courts free of charge upon production of their ID card.

The Tidworth Leisure Centre is unique ! It is an MOD building but it is operated in partnership with Kennet District Council and the Wiltshire County & Army Library Services, with the result that it can be used by both the Garrison and the local community.

Tax Credits



Last April, the Government introduced a Tax Credit system to assist working people on a low income and those with children.

Soon, claims will need to be renewed. The Inland Revenue will be sending out review packs between April and July of this year.

Payments will not be stopped whilst renewals are being assessed, but if you have been paid too much in the past year, then any overpayment will be deducted from the amount you receive.

If this adjustment, following an overpayment, in your tax credit award is causing you real hardship or debt problems, you can contact the Inland Revenue helpline to request help.

The Community Challenge 2003 Award Ceremony

2003 was another great year in the history of the Challenge, which was begun in 1995 with the aim of creating and fostering pride in our community.

Community projects carried out by local people throughout 2003 were praised by the Lord Lieutenant, Lt General Sir Maurice Johnston, as he presented awards to those who took part.

Some of the projects entered in the Challenge included the **Castledown School Gardening Group**, set up to encourage pupils to take more responsibility for and have pride in their environment by taking on the upkeep of the Ludgershall War Memorial and rose garden; the **Zouch Primary School Wildlife & Pond Project** which built a wildlife corner at the school opened by Charlie Dimmock; and the **Chute Gardening Club Potato-growing competition**, an event which engendered much friendly rivalry and community spirit in the village !

This year, however, the Barclays Shield was presented to the **Friday Drop-In at the Ludgershall Memorial Hall**, a

group run by volunteers which meets a real need within the community and which celebrated its 10th Anniversary this year.

The first of the two Tidworth Parish Council Shields was presented to the **South Tidworth Chapel Group**, whose members completed the Herculean task of clearing undergrowth and rubbish from the burial ground surrounding the Memorial Chapel, recording and photographing the burials and removing ivy from the headstones and Chapel walls;

The second Parish Council Shield was presented to Annette Scott for organising "Eve's Day" which raised £3,530 for cancer charities, the disease from which her daughter-in-law had died earlier in the year. Mrs Scott was praised for her achievement, supported especially by 1PWRR, her son's regiment. Eve's Day was chosen by the Judges as being the best Challenge of 2003, recognising Mrs Scott's considerable personal effort - an outstanding contribution to the community.

DJ Baz Reilly opens Tidworth's new Information, Advice & Guidance Centre

The Tempo and e-info Information, Advice and Guidance Services which have, up until now, been situated in Melksham House in Wylde Road, have now moved to a new location on Pennings Road, two doors up from the Post Office, which will be a far more convenient location for everyone using the Centre.

"This centre seems to be able to meet the needs of pretty much anyone in Tidworth", said Baz Reilly, as he opened the Centre. "I could use the service if I needed advice and guidance about work or training, if I wanted help with IT solutions for a small business, if I was a student wanting to do some research, if I fancied improving my IT skills or even if I just wanted to email some photos. It's a great idea and I think the people of Tidworth will really benefit from it".

This centre has been made possible by financial help and support from a number of different partners including the Smartplace Partnership, Kennet District Council, the Learning and Skills Council through the Learning Curve Network, Learndirect, Sustain the Plain and Wiltshire and Swindon Information, Advice and Guidance Partnership.

"Without these partners we would not have been able to



provide such a multi-functional and professional service", said Steve Lawton, Chief Executive of Tidworth Development Trust.

Drums Beat for Exercise Zulu Return

5 Field Squadron, 22 Engineer Regiment



Seven members of 5 Field Squadron were invited to South Africa to represent the Corps on behalf of the British High Commission at several acts of remembrance and reconciliation to mark the 125th anniversary of two battles which took place in January 1879: Isandhlwana and Rorke's Drift.

At Isandhlwana, Zulu warriors armed only with assegais, spears and shields, defeated British forces armed with the most modern of weapons. The few British survivors escaped to the small garrison of Rorke's Drift, where they withstood Zulu attack for 10 hours until a relief column arrived. Victoria Crosses were awarded to eleven of the defenders of Rorke's Drift, one of whom was Lt John Chard of the 5th Field Company.

After taking part in the 20 km road race from Isandhlwana to Rorke's Drift, the route taken by the survivors, the seven members of 5 Fd Sqn returned to Isandhlwana for the official events to mark the 125th anniversary. The King of Zululand and the British High Commissioner watched a re-enactment of the battle, afterwards laying wreaths at the Zulu memorial. The Engineer in Chief, Brigadier DR ff Innes ADC, laid a wreath on behalf of the Corps.

Seeing the places, meeting the people and hearing so many different accounts of bravery from both the British and the Zulus brought the events of 125 years ago to life. It was a great honour to take part in the events, as representatives of the Corps and the British people.

Tidworth bids farewell to Police Sergeant Paul Oatway



When Paul Oatway was posted to Tidworth in 1996, he was told that he would only be here for a few months, but, 9 years later, he is still here and has enjoyed his time here so much that he will be sorry to leave.

His biggest achievement has been the great improvement in the crime figures in this area. Recent figures show the number of crimes reported in Tidworth to be 515, (compared with 1015 in Marlborough and 1382 in Devizes). In addition to this, the detection rate in Tidworth is 37.5%, (compared with 27% in the whole County). "My ambition when I arrived here, was to make Tidworth a safer and better place to live and work", Sgt Oatway told Drumbeat. "In fact we have driven crime down and the detection rate up".

"I shall miss working with the Army and the local community; there are a lot of fine people on both sides who have done a lot to develop the community in recent years and although I shall miss being part of that, I am sure my successor will continue the good work.

"In my time here I have worked with 4 Garrison Commanders and 5 GSMs and have always had a very good working relationship with Garrison Headquarters, the Royal Military Police and the Ministry of Defence Police, all of which has added to the way we have been able to police the town effectively.

"Wiltshire Police is part of the whole community : I have enjoyed working behind the scenes helping to organise major parades for regiments such as the RDG and the KRH and Officers from Tidworth Station have taken part in the Community Challenge every year since it began: we have cycled from Land's End to Westminster and trekked over Dartmoor - not forgetting the Purbeck Plod ! - all to raise money for local charities. This year, some of the money we raised will be donated to the Army Benevolent Fund.

"For me, the most memorable event in my career came last year when I received the Queen's Police Medal, recognising 32 years' service and what has been achieved in Tidworth. This, of course, would not have been possible without the very, very dedicated Police Officers in my team and I would like to thank them for all their hard work."



Sgt Oatway leaves Wiltshire Constabulary after 32 years' service and will be joining the Senior Management Team at Salisbury Police Station where he will be responsible for the whole of "A" (Salisbury) Division as Head of Criminal Justice.

The Garrison Commanders, past and present, and all ranks thank him for his sterling support to the whole of our community and wish him well for the future.

Stuart Macaulay, Media Ops Officer with 1 Mechanized Brigade reports from Basra :

"The boys are all here, they've arrived safely and are raring to go ! We've had 4 - 10 days down south to acclimatise ourselves to the heat; temperatures are 35 - 40 °C and rising, although thankfully there is a bit of a breeze at the moment and humidity is down.

"The whole ethos is to get out there, meet the Iraqi people, find out their problems and try to solve them. It's the British way, it's what we've been doing and it works. We are making some real progress here helping the the Iraqi people to rebuild their country and hopefully the momentum will increase as time goes on.

"We'll be reporting back to the Garrison every week to let everyone know how we're getting on."
