Pay as you Dine



Coming soon to this Garrison

Pay As You Dine (PAYD) is coming to Project Allenby/Connaught (PAC) from March 2014 and involves some of the last Garrisons to 'go live' in the UK. Military personnel have complained about the unfairness of the Daily Food Charge regime for many years and the PAYD system has been recommended by independent parties and is now Ministry of Defence (MOD) policy. PAYD is a new approach to paying for non-operational catering, where soldiers pay for each meal as they choose it, rather than through a monthly salary deduction.

One-Way to Kiwi School

Part of Hubert Hamilton Road, outside Kiwi Primary School in Bulford, will be made into a one-way road in an effort to make the road safer for everyone at school drop-off and collecting times when the traffic can be quite chaotic.

Cars will be able to turn into Hubert Hamilton Road from Marlborough Road, but once they have passed the school entrance, they will have to continue up the one-way stretch, (in red), and re-join Marlborough Road at its junction with Marne Road. ●



Cars emerging from the school grounds will be able to turn right out towards Marlborough Road, as before.

"We want to safeguard the children at busy times and we hope this will do the trick", said Head Teacher, Susan Raeburn.

The work is due to be carried out during the school half term week.



4 RIFLES mark the end of their Tour



4 RIFLES held a medals parade in Ward Barracks on Monday, 9th December. Approximately 3,000 people came to watch HRH The Duchess of Cornwall present the soldiers with their Afghanistan Campaign medals, marking the end of Operation HERRICK 18.

"HERRICK 18 presented the Battalion with a new set of complex, sensitive and dangerous challenges, which you met with your characteristic professionalism, determination and unique 4 Rifles spirit", the Duchess told the assembled men. "I am so grateful that you have all returned to share in the success of your tour. You have made your country and your Royal Colonel extremely proud - well done, and thank you."

Earlier in the day, 4 RIFLES were in Salisbury, invited by the City Council to exercise their Freedom to march through the City. As part of the event, the Battalion formed up on the Market Square where those soldiers who came from the local area were presented with their operational medals by the Mayor of Salisbury, Councillor Mrs Penny Brown and The Lord Lieutenant for Wiltshire, Mrs Sarah Troughton.

"The welcome from the local community was quite phenomenal", said the Commanding Officer, Lt Col Tom Bewick. "As a way of marking our return, I do not think it could have gone any better.

"It was a great tour", he continued. "This was the first tour this Battalion has been on that we can honestly say that we came back without any serious casualties. That is the mark of the progress in its own right. We were working very closely with the Afghan National Forces and to have seen how they have developed over the last seven years is genuinely heartening".

PAYD is going live in 62 restaurants and messes across PAC as follows:

Bulford and Swinton Bks - March 2014

Tidworth - July 2014

Aldershot - November 2014

Larkhill and Warminster - March 2015

Why change to PAYD ?

Fairness - Under the old system, living-in soldiers had to pay for meals whether they attended them or not.

Choosing what and when to eat - The feeding habits of our soldiers have changed over the past 20 years and continue to do so, with a greater demand for flexibility in what to eat and when to eat it.

Welcoming the Wider Defence Community - Under PAYD, restaurants are open to the Wider Defence Community as well as military personnel, including Service families and friends.

Will PAYD be more expensive ?

PAYD gives you the flexibility to purchase food when and where you want to, so how much to spend on meals is completely up to the customer. However, the provision of three meals a day is still available at the same price as the amount currently deducted from soldiers' wages, currently £4.52 a day.

What happens if soldiers don't have any money ?

If soldiers are unable to pay for their food, arrangements for the provision of three meals a day can be made with unit admin offices, but this money is expected to be paid back through soldiers' pay (JSP 456, chapter 7).

PAYD will bring a significant change to the way catering is delivered to the 18,000 soldiers supported by PAC, but it is a tried and tested MOD system that has been in place for over 10 years in other Garrisons.

Public Consultation

Army Rebasing - Housing development plans

The second phase of the Public Consultation on the subject of housing development plans for Army Rebasing will be starting in February.

A Briefing for invited Stakeholders with presentations from Wiltshire Council, HQ 43 (Wessex) Brigade, DIO and its Master planning consultants took place on 29th January.

Road Safety Advice for Vehicles and Runners

In general, runners are advised to avoid roads and run on tracks and paths if at all possible and take great care at all times.

- Do not run two (or more) abreast;
- If road avoidance is impossible, face oncoming traffic unless on very sharp right-hand bends;
- It is absolutely essential that runners wear high visibility vests;
- Beware of iPod entertainment systems preventing you from hearing the noise of the traffic in the area;
- Be aware of the direction of the sun which, when low, blinds motorists;
- Take extra care when tired at the end of a run;
- Do not run on roads without pavements during low light conditions.

Particularly dangerous areas are :

- The Range Road, between Tidworth and Bulford;
- Bulford Drove Way, Carter Barracks;
- Double Hedges in Bulford and Marlborough Road (A303 to the 4x4 garage in Bulford);
- The road between GR SU 154486 and GR SU 169438 (the road between Netheravon and Bulford Village via Figheldean).

If you are in any doubt as to where it is safe to run or cycle, please contact your PTIs and/or safety personnel.

Medals in Marlborough



Soldiers from 4 Military Intelligence Battalion (4MI Bn) exercised its Freedom of Marlborough on 28th November, by marching through the town with fixed bayonets and flags flying. This ancient privilege was granted to the Battalion in June 2011, making it the first Army unit to have been awarded Marlborough's Freedom of Entry since 1204.

A greyhound features on Marlborough's coat of arms and the close ties between the town and the

Battalion are demonstrated by the Battalion's choice of a greyhound as their mascot. The dog, "Blue", attended the parade.

When they reached the High Street, 80 soldiers from 45 Company were presented with their operational service medals for Op HERRICK 18 by the Chief of the Defence Staff, General Sir Nicholas Houghton, the Colonel Commandant of the Intelligence Corps, and the Mayor of Marlborough, Mr Guy Loosmore.

2RTR Medals Parade

250 soldiers of the 2nd Royal Tank Regiment were presented with their campaign medals at a parade held at Aliwal Barracks on 14 December 2013.



The Regiment deployed on Op HERRICK 18 in a diversity of roles : Battle Group Headquarters and Egypt Squadron deployed as Transition Support Unit in Lashkar Gah, responsible for providing support to the Afghan National Security Forces. Badger Squadron deployed as the Warthog Group, supporting deliberate operations conducted by British Forces and Cyclops Squadron Headquarters deployed as mentors to an Afghan National Army unit.

The 'Tankies' were presented with their medals by Lt Gen Chris Deverell MBE, Chief of Materiel LAND, and Quarter Master General.

Elements of 2 RTR have deployed over ten times in the last eight years and Op HERRICK 18 was their final operational tour ahead of the merger with 1st Royal Tank Regiment in August 2014.

Christine Hiatt, who retired from the Civil Service in March this year, has been awarded the Imperial Service Medal for her 37 years' faithful service to the Ministry of Defence.

Christine first joined the MoD in June 1975 when she went to work in the Gunnery Wing at Larkhill. In 1999 she moved to the Army Court Service as a Court Assistant, working in cramped office conditions in Bulford until the new Military Court Centre was built in 2005-6. The new building serves not just the Army but all military units in the South West of the country, its two courtrooms equipped with hi-tech IT and video conferencing facilities. Christine continued to work there until she retired.

She was presented with the ISM at the Military Court Centre on 26th November by the Vice Judge Advocate General, His Honour Michael Hunter, and the Director of the Military Court Service, Miles Crowley.
