Netheravon prepares for the first Wingsuit World Cup



The British Army's freefall display team, "The Red Devils", are pictured here preparing for the opening ceremony of the first ever FAI World Cup of Wingsuit Performance Flying, which took place in Netheravon Airfield at the end of May, hosted by the Army Parachute Association.

The British Team comprised 12 competitors, 12 of whom are APA members, 2 currently serving and 5 ex-Forces.

Jackie Harper, Secretary of the APA, spoke to Drumbeat:

"We have 19 Countries participating in the Wingsuit World Cup, from 5 continental regions - only Africa is missing! We are praying for good weather so that we can complete the competition and set a raft of new World Records.

"Hosting this inaugural event is a huge honour, both for the Army Parachute Association here at Netheravon and for British Skydiving as the UK has never hosted a world level skydiving competition before.

"By the time your readers read this article the first World Cup Champion of Wingsuit Performance Flying will have been determined (and we hope it's a Brit!). We are delighted to be supported by the Army Sports Control Board and Team Army who have been a great help in allowing us to host this event."

Jackie and her husband, Spike, are both members of the British team - currently No. 1 and No.2 in the world rankings.



Garrison's Nepal Earthquake Appeal raises Thousands

The devastating earthquakes that struck Nepal at the end of April, and again a couple of weeks later, have caused a huge amount of damage and hardship in that country.

With a large number of Gurkha soldiers serving in the Garrison area and an even larger number of Nepalese who work for the contractor (Aspire/Sodexo), the Garrison mounted a fund raising appeal to raise money for the Disaster Emergency Committee (DEC).

The reason for this 'one off' action was not just the scale of the earthquake and the resulting devastation, but also the close historical links that the British Army has with the Nepalese through the 200-year historical link with the Gurkhas.

The Garrison kicked off the appeal with a £1000 donation and, supported by Garrison units, Aspire Defence and the wider community, the money quickly started to come in through a number of fundraising activities, which included collection tins around the Garrison, a bagpacking session at Tesco Tidworth and curry lunches.



The culmination of the fundraising effort was a charity concert in the Tidworth Garrison Theatre on 21st May.

Approximately £17,000 has been raised so far in support of the Nepalese and TNB Garrison would like to thank everyone involved for their generosity.

The money will go to the DEC in order to support the relief effort in Nepal. Particular thanks go to the Band of the Royal Artillery and the Salisbury Plain and Tidworth Military Wives Choirs for supporting the charity concert on 21st May, which was a resounding success.

The Army Welfare Service has four contact houses within the Eastern Salisbury Plain area. These are at 23 Abbots Close in Tidworth, 27 Dorset Close in Bulford, 24 Pembroke Road in Upavon (all 3-bedroom houses) and 20 Graham Square in Larkhill (2-bedroom, ground floor flat). These houses are available throughout the year to Service personnel with priority given to single parents for contact with children. They are also available to book for other occasions. Nightly charges are £25 (house)/£20 (flat) with a minimum weekend charge of £75/£60 regardless of the number of nights used.

Waterloo 200

18th June is Waterloo Day and this year marks the 200th Anniversary of the battle, which took place in Belgium in 1815. It was one of history's landmark battles which finally brought to an end 25 years of war in Europe, following the French Revolution in

Napoleon Bonaparte had emerged from the Revolution as France's best military commander, soon becoming Consul and finally Emperor. He led the armies of France across Europe, overturning governments and régimes, putting his family on the thrones of

Holland, Naples and Spain.

Coalitions of European powers united against him, with the Duke of Wellington commanding British Forces in the Iberian Peninsula.

In 1812, Napoleon suffered his first real setback. Despite winning the battle of Borodino and reaching Moscow, disease and the length of his supply line forced a French retreat, with many men dying of the cold during the homeward march. Of the 680,000

men who had invaded Russia, only 120,000 returned.

In 1814, Napoleon was captured and exiled to the island of Elba. However, in February 1815 he escaped, marching up through France and calling the nation to arms, his 'Grande Armée' gathering in Boulogne and once again threatening to invade Britain.

A 7th Coalition was formed against him consisting of Britain, Prussia, Austria and Russia, whose representatives had been attending the Congress of Vienna to discuss the future of Europe. Rather than wait for the Coalition to assemble a co-ordinated attack, Napoleon marched eastwards, intending attack before they were ready, crossing the border into Belgium and positioning his Army between the Prussians and the British.

In Brussels, the Duke of Wellington was apprised of Napoleon's intentions while attending the Duchess of Richmond's ball. He is said to have borrowed a map to plan his action, while men took their leave of their hostess, to prepare for the coming battle.

Fighting began the following day when the French engaged

In 1815, the Collingbournes were part of the Estate of the Marquis of Ailesbury, whose two sons were killed at Waterloo. In their memory, two farms on the estate were named 'Mount Orleans' and 'Hougoumont' after the farms on the battlefield. Hougoumont Farm is north of Tidworth on the road towards Everleigh*


Prussian troops led by Prince Blucher at Ligny and the British at Quatre Bras. On 18th June, the decisive battle took place just outside the village of Waterloo. British troops held firm against French attacks throughout the day until the Prussians arrived in early evening and the French were finally routed.

Napoleon fled westwards but, finding his escape to the USA blocked by the British Navy, surrendered to Captain Frederick Maitland of HMS Bellerophon. He was later exiled to the island of St Helena where he died in May 1821.

After Waterloo, peace reigned on the

continent of Europe for 100 years, until the outbreak of the First World War in 1914.

Tidworth will commemorate Waterloo with a Musical Pageant



Plans to celebrate the Centenary of the battle were cancelled because Europe was once again at war.

To commemorate the Bi-Centenary of the Battle of Waterloo, Tidworth, Netheravon and Bulford Garrison will be holding a Musical Pageant followed by a firework finale, in Tedworth Park on Saturday, 26th September. Waterloo will be the theme and it is hoped that there will be displays by The King's Troop and Re-enactment Groups, for added interest.



These are provided for unit bulk waste only.

Occupants of SLA who wish dispose of bulky household, POL and vehicle items should contact their respective unit SHEF representatives for assistance and advice. Occupants of SFA should visit Wiltshire Council website (http://www.wiltshire.gov.uk/rubbishrecycling/householdwaste), which contains information on how to dispose of household rubbish via local Recycling facilities in Everleigh, Amesbury and Andover or by using the disposal service provided by the Council.

If you do not wish to continue using this service, **please do not ask the Council to take away your green bin**. You may not want to use the service, but the next person moving in may want to and it will cost £25 to have a new green bin delivered.

A Notice for Dog Owners Please keep control of your dog!

An incident occurred in Tedworth Park last month in which a person was out jogging, accompanied by their dog. The dog was not on a lead and it suddenly changed course, running towards a horse and its rider. The rider was thrown from the horse, although (luckily) avoided serious injury.

There have been similar incidents in the past in which dogs have chased horses in their paddocks and the horses have been badly cut by wire fencing.

Dogs must be kept under proper control at all times. This particularly applies to cyclists and joggers who allow their dogs to run beside them, and especially in areas where there are livestock/ horses.

Owners should not allow their dogs to foul grassed areas, which as well as being anti-social, creates a health hazard. It is the responsibility of dog owners to clear up any mess made by their dog in any public area.
