Sounding The Last Post

Lt Chris Ashford, Troop Commander of the 19 Regiment Royal Artillery Pipes and Drums, stepped in to sound 'The Last Post' and 'Reveille' at the Garrison's Remembrance services this year.

Make sure those new Christmas presents stay yours !



The Royal Military Police are encouraging everyone in the Garrison to take extra security measures during the festive season, whether you are staying here or going away on leave.

- Place presents under your Christmas tree as late as possible - do not leave them in full view of windows.
- If you receive valuable gifts such as electronics or bicycles ensure you register these at either www.immobilise.com or www.bikeregister.com which will maximise the chance of the Police returning these items to you should they be stolen.
- Do not keep large amounts of money at home.
- Having a secure home will reduce the chance of burglary. Lock all windows and doors and keep keys out of sight.
- If you are going out, draw the curtains and leave a light and a radio on. Alternatively place a light and radio on a timer switch.
- On Christmas day dispose of packaging carefully. Piles of empty boxes can advertise that you have nice new goods.

1 MERCIAN scale Highest Mountain in England

Soldiers from 1 MERCIAN have scaled Scafell Pike, the highest mountain in England, climbing through the clouds to the top of the world.

"The weather was pretty good to us all the way to the top of Scafell Pike meaning that we were able to keep our top layer down to the minimum of just a t-shirt", said Sgt Evans who led the trip. "Once at the summit, though, the clouds drew in which caused the temperature to drop slightly.

"On the route down we traversed over and took in the peak of Lingmel and then dropped down off of the feature with a steep descent. After a full afternoon of walking the descent was hard on the knees - perhaps a more gradual descent for any future hikes would be better - especially for us older participants ! "

One Step Ahead of the Freeze

We all know that keeping ourselves safe and warm during the winter months is important, but have you thought about applying the same principles to your quarter ? Let's take a look at how you can prepare your home for the impending winter weather :

- **Guttering and roof** - Look up and check the outside of your property. Loose or broken roof tiles could fly off in high winds and damage your property, or someone else's.
- **Central Heating** – Check that your heating is working correctly and keep it at a temperature of 15 degrees in cold weather, even when you are away on holiday, which should help to prevent pipes from freezing.
- **Freezing pipes** – the damage caused by a burst pipe can be catastrophic so it is vital you know where your stopcock is so you can turn off the water in an emergency. If your outside tap has a hose attached, remove it and isolate the water supply to it.
- **Internal doors** – by keeping your internal doors open, warm air will be able to flow through your house meaning that all rooms will be kept warm - not just the one you are sitting in.
- **Keeping an eye on your property** – if you are planning to go away, particularly for any length of time, leave your keys with a trusted neighbour and ask them to check your home regularly. Make sure they have our Helpdesk contact details in case any emergency repairs need to be done in your absence.

Illegal Driving on Salisbury Plain



Wiltshire Police in partnership with the MOD, HQ SPTA and the Defence Infrastructure Organisation (DIO), are committed to reducing incidents of illegal vehicle activity on the Plain.

Irresponsible 'off-roading' activity is placing legitimate users (both military and members of the public) at risk. It is also disrupting training and is causing damage to the training area.



The unauthorised use of motor vehicles (both 4-wheel and 2-wheel) is in breach of the Salisbury Plain Military Lands Bye-laws.

Service personnel have been amongst those dealt with after using their private vehicles on SPTA, thinking that the Bye Laws do not apply to them. They have either received words of advice about the standard of their driving/riding, or there have been more serious cases of illegal vehicle use, resulting in prosecution and fines. One individual may lose his licence.

Offences such as "Driving other than on a road" and "Driving without valid insurance" have been dealt with by fixed penalty tickets, currently up to £300 and 6 penalty points. Convictions and penalty points can have a considerable financial impact, for example : fines, increased insurance premiums and the potential threat to livelihood or earnings.

Military Lands Bye-law signs are displayed at all prominent Public Rights of Way track entrances to the area.

Relevant to off-roading activity are the following points :

- All vehicles must be road legal, i.e. taxed, insured, have a valid MOT and a number plate, etc.
- Drivers must comply with all MOD signs and notices (e.g. "Keep out when flags are flying") and must comply with the universal speed limit of 30 mph.
- Motor vehicles only have the right to use appropriate rights of way i.e. 'Byways Open to All Traffic', when not closed by barriers or red flags.
- Motor vehicles may also use military roads made up for vehicular use (e.g. stone tracks) but MUST give way to all military activity.
- Motor vehicles must not enter any wooded plantation unless on a right of way authorised for motor vehicles.



NB. mini-motor bikes are not road-legal and therefore cannot be insured. They can therefore ONLY be used on truly 'private property' where no members of the public have access.
