Carillion plc

On 15th January, the construction company, Carillion plc, announced that it would be entering into immediate compulsory liquidation. It is hoped that the effect on the Garrison and those living in Service Families Accommodation will be negligible; the following reassurances are taken from statements issued by CarillionAmey and Aspire Defence :

Statement by CarillionAmey

"... CarillionAmey Ltd and CarillionAmey (Housing Prime) Ltd are two separate legal entities that operate independently of Carillion.

The terms of the joint ventures' arrangements mean that Amey will continue the services now that Carillion has announced it is entering into immediate compulsory liquidation. Amey is committed to doing this and ensuring continuity of service to the DIO and MOD and the service men and women in the UK ...

For the past few weeks, Amey have been working on detailed contingency plans with the DIO and the Cabinet Office to ensure CarillionAmey can effectively continue to manage their contracts and these are being implemented today. (15th January)

CarillionAmey can confirm that they are fully prepared to continue the service obligation of these contracts without adverse effect on the employees of the JV or our supply chain."

Statement by Aspire Defence

Following the insolvency announcement on 15 January 2018 by Carillion plc, Aspire Defence wishes to reassure our staff and supply chain:

Delivery of the Project Allenby/Connaught contract and Army Basing Programme (ABP) construction works continue as normal. We do not anticipate any disruption to payment of staff and suppliers.

Aspire Defence Capital Works, Aspire Defence Services and Aspire Defence Services Limited are joint ventures between Carillion and KBR. The insolvency of Carillion has triggered certain contractual arrangements that 'ring-fence' the joint ventures from Carillion. These are designed to ensure the Project continues to deliver Services and the ABP Works, mitigating any potential effects of the liquidation.

Contingency plans have been put into action and contractual discussions are underway. An updated statement will be issued in due course.

Notice of Road Closure near the Canadian Estate, Bulford

Wiltshire Council has made an Order to close temporarily to all traffic, part of the Bulford Road near the Canadian Estate in Bulford. The section of the road affected will be from its junction with Churchill Avenue to its junction with Quebec Road.

The closure will enable Chasetown Civil Engineering Ltd to build a new entrance into the housing development and to connect utilities for that development.

The closure and diversion route will be clearly indicated by traffic signs.

This Order will come into operation in mid March and it is anticipated that the works will take approximately a month to complete, depending upon weather conditions. Access will be maintained for residents and businesses where possible, although delays are likely due to the nature of the works. The Order will have a maximum duration of 18 months.

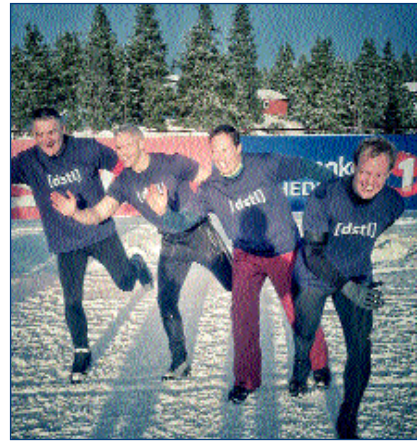

Skiing uphill in Lycra !

The Military Advisors from the Defence Science and Tech Labs (DSTL) deployed to Sjusjøen in Norway on Ex NORDIC BLUEBELL for 11 days of classic Nordic ski training, in a bid to increase awareness of the sport through a challenging exercise, in addition to trying something new. As you would expect, all three were seasoned alpine skiers but other than a notion that this Nordic activity involved 'skiing uphill in lycra' none had anything further to offer!

Day one produced lots of falling over, uncontrolled stopping and rather too much lunging, but by day 2 we had shown progress! The rest of the week continued with hills (both up and down) and 13.5 mile cross-country ski to a neighbouring village on the promise of hot chocolate and cake. The café was shut!

The week culminated with 7.5km race where all skill levels, backgrounds, units and experiences deployed on the exercise would be pitched against each other. With a flurry of lycra, much sweating and snowballs for the last



man across the line, this excellent exercise was over.

Exercise SNOWSTORM 18

From 20 Jan to 3 Feb 18 two teams and two individuals from Tidworth, Netheravon and Bulford (TNB) Garrison deployed on the Royal Artillery Snowboard Competition, Ex SNOW STORM 18, which took place in the resort of Flachauwinkl in Austria. The competition is designed to promote the sport of snowboarding and to provide the opportunity to select and train the RA Regimental Snowboarding Team that will compete at the Army Championships, Ex SNOWJACK, in late March.

The first week contains a rigorous program of two, four-hour training sessions a day where riders learn and hone the skills required to negotiate the challenges of the three main competition events : pairs giant slalom, boarder cross and freestyle. Although the more popular freestyle event is important, it is from the racing events that most of the RA Team will be chosen.

The competition ends with a prize giving, hosted this year by the Chairman of the RA Snowboarding Association, Brig N S Pond MBE, who subsequently announces the names of those chosen to represent the RA at the Army Championships. Ex SNOWSTORM goes from strength to

strength, with the RA camp currently one of the best attended pan-Army. Competitors come from across the spectrum of rank but predominantly more junior ranks. That so many are able to attend and compete is a great success and largely due to the support of sports funds such as the fund held by HQ TNB Garrison.



NSPCC receives Army Grant

NSPCC support services for Army families have been boosted by a major grant from the Army Central Fund. The grant of £225,000, spread over 3 years, will be shared equally between the NSPCC Centres in Tidworth and Catterick.

The announcement was made by Julian Panton, Secretary of the Upavon-based Army Central Fund, who said :

"We have had a long relationship with the NSPCC centres in Catterick and Tidworth and we are very keen to continue providing support for the important work they do with the Army community."

The NSPCC Service Centre (Ashdown Centre) in Tidworth's Drummer Lane provides a number of services to military families, alongside the civilian community. These include the informal **Time Together** drop-in for parents, carers and children up to eight years of age, encouraging friendships and bonding, and **Pregnancy In Mind** - helping mums and dads cope with the ups and downs of having a baby.

Meanwhile, **Babies in Mind** provides babies and their carers with the chance to learn about development and relaxation, the **Military Lunch Club** is run in local schools to offer the children of soldiers a special support service, and the new **Emotional Resilience in Children (ERIC)** group helps youngsters aged eight to 10 deal with their feelings and behaviours.

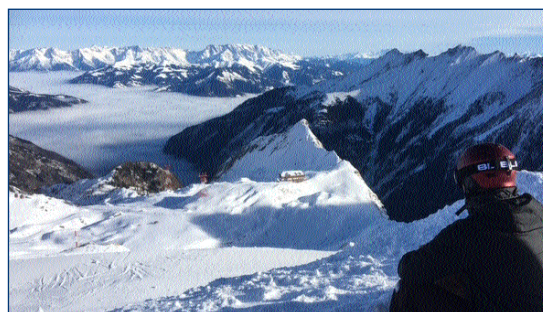
Exercise Jellalabad Tiger

Army Welfare Service Personal Support

The Army Welfare Service (AWS) Personal Support (PS) aims to provide a confidential and non-discriminatory support service to serving personnel and their dependents, providing guidance and support as required. This is a confidential service; everything you tell us will be treated in absolute confidence except in very exceptional circumstances as detailed in the AWS Code of Confidentiality.

PS teams are made up of military and civilian Army Welfare Workers (AWW's). They aim to help married and single personnel, and their families, with any personal or family difficulty by providing a confidential, professional and specialised welfare service.

AWW's are trained to support, advise and encourage personnel to manage their problems more effectively, dealing with a variety of issues ranging from relationship problems, substance abuse and mental health concerns to problems arising from deployment and disability.

Referrals for personal support can be made by anyone, ensuring that consent is provided by the Service User (SU) if not self-referring. The Intake and Assessment Team (IAT), York, is the initial hub for receiving and processing referrals, which are then transferred to the relevant AWS team for ongoing support. News from Barrow Clump



This beautiful early Saxon bowl is one of the most recent artefacts to have been found at Barrow Clump, during an archaeological dig carried out by military veterans from Breaking Ground Heritage working alongside Wessex Archaeology. Breaking Ground Heritage is part of Op Nightingale, which uses archaeology as a route to recovery for injured Service Personnel.

Barrow Clump is one of the many Bronze Age burial mounds to be found on Salisbury Plain and the Saxon cemetery is located nearby. The archaeological dig was necessary in order to record the monument before it was destroyed by the action of badgers.

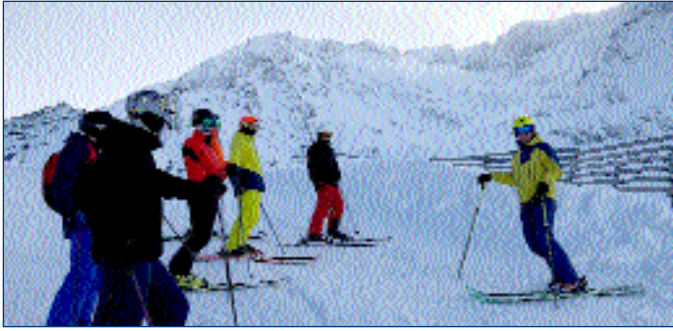

On the 9th December 2017 The King's Royal Hussars took 26 soldiers and officers on an adventurous training ski trip to Val Thorens to undertake a variety of Alpine and Touring training.

For the Ski Foundation 1 (Beginners) course, the week consisted of basic ski training on the learner slopes, slowly progressing to more challenging runs. This group is now capable of undertaking the next stage in training, SF2, on their way to becoming Army Ski Instructors.

The SF2 course was focused on refining alpine techniques, including the use of skins attached to the bottom of the ski, allowing the user to move uphill without slipping down. They also perfected the ever important kick turn - which allows you to turn up the slope from a standstill. This was mixed in with some excellent off-piste skiing.

For so early in the season the snow cover was excellent and nearly all the runs were open, allowing for some excellent ski training by all. The trip was a great success with the vast majority of participants achieving their SF1 or SF2 certificates that will allow them to continue their Ski Training.

This adventurous training has benefited from a grant from the Garrison Commander's Fund.
